ORDINANCE NO. 2015-082

An Ordinance amending Sections 505.01, 505.11 and 505.52 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit to add language concerning service animals in order to conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and related regulations, for the Executive, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Section 35.104 of Title 28 of the United States Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R."), issued pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Title 42 of the United States Code ("U.S.C.") Sections 12101-12213, Title 47 U.S.C. Section 225, defines the term "service animal" "as any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability;" and

WHEREAS, Section 955.011(B)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") defines the term "assistance dog" as a "guide dog, hearing dog, or service dog that has been trained by a nonprofit special agency;" and

WHEREAS, ORC § 955.011(A) provides that "[w]hen an application is made for registration of an assistance dog and the owner can show proof by certificate or other means that the dog is an assistance dog, the owner of the dog shall be exempt from any fee for the registration;" and

WHEREAS, 28 C.F.R. § 35.136 expressly prohibits the County from requiring documentation, such as proof that an animal has been certified, trained or licensed as a service animal; and

WHEREAS, because ORC § 955.011 conflicts with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and related regulations over the requirement that an applicant for registration of a service animal provide documentation that said animal has been certified, trained or licensed as a service animal, it is preempted by federal law; and

WHEREAS, for the aforementioned reasons, it is necessary to amend Sections 505.01, 505.11 and 505.52 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit to add language concerning service animals in order to conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and related regulations; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to amend Sections 505.01, 505.11 and 505.52 of the Codified Ordinances for the aforementioned reasons;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that;

SECTION 1

Sections 505.01, entitled "Animal Definitions Generally," 505.11, entitled "Animals Prohibited in Stores," and 505.52, entitled "Registration of Dogs; Tags Required," of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, are hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit A, attached to this Ordinance and incorporated herein as if fully restated.

SECTION 2

This Ordinance is declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason that it immediately amends Sections 505.01, 505.11 and 505.52 of the Codified Ordinances to conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and related regulations.

SECTION 3

Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 4

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
