Robinson, the County Engineer concludes that a 30-ton load limitation should be imposed on the Riverview Road Bridge over Columbia Run, Bridge number BST-009-1430, located in Boston Township, Council District 1; and  WHEREAS, the imposition of a bridge load limit, with restrictions set at less than 40 tons gross vehicle weight, requires amendment of Section 339.12 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit; and  WHEREAS, this Council has determined by reviewing all pertinent information that the acceptance and approval of the aforementioned amendment to Section 339.12 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit;

	Section 339.12 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, entitled "Bridge Weight Limits," is amended as follows:  "339.12 BRIDGE WEIGHT LIMITS.  (a) No person shall operate any vehicle upon any of the following bridges, if such vehicle, the gross weight of which, exceeds the maximum load limit specified for each respective bridge:

- (b) The County Engineer shall place and maintain, at both ends of each respective bridge, signs of substantial construction to conspicuously indicate the maximum weight limitations of vehicle and load as provided herein.
- (c) In addition to criminal prosecution for violation of this section, in case of any injury to any bridge by reason of the violation of the weight limitation, damages shall be recovered by civil action on behalf of the County.
- (d) Whoever violates any provision of this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor on a first offense; on a second offense within one year after the first offense, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree; on each subsequent offense within one year after the second offense, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree."

This Ordinance is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason to immediately prevent damage or collapse of a bridge.

## **SECTION 3**

Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

## **SECTION 4**
