WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to urge the United States Senate to provide advice and consent on the President's Supreme Court nominee, Judge Merrick Garland.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

This Council hereby urges the United States Senate to perform its constitutional duty to provide advice and consent on the President's Supreme Court nominee by:

- (A) Promptly scheduling a hearing of the Senate Judiciary Committee for Judge Merrick Garland, so that his nomination can be considered on its merits in an open and transparent manner;
- (B) Holding a confirmation vote on the Senate floor, with opportunity for debate on Judge Merrick Garland's nomination; and
- (C) Working on behalf of the people of the United States to ensure that the vacancy on the Supreme Court is filled without undue and unnecessary delay so that the Supreme Court can effectively serve its essential Constitutional function as the final arbiter of the law.

SECTION 2

The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the United States Senate and to the Senators representing the state of the Ohio.

SECTION 3

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason of urging the United States Senate to act immediately to avoid the aforementioned negative consequences of an ongoing unfilled seat on the Supreme Court.

SECTION 4

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 5

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
