7 **A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute a sanitary sewer service**  
8 **agreement with the City of Twinsburg, in which the County shall purchase 650,000 gallons**  
9 **per day capacity in Twinsburg’s waste water treatment plant, for an amount not to exceed**  
10 **\$1,900,000.00; send sanitary sewer flow from the Reminderville Service Area to Twinsburg**  
11 **for treatment and disposal; proportionately participate in capital projects in Twinsburg’s**  
12 **waste water treatment plant; and shall quarterly pay Twinsburg’s flat residential sewer**  
13 **rate multiplied by a factor of 1.5 for each single family equivalent in the Reminderville**  
14 **Service Area, for a term of 25 years, in Council District 1, for the Executive’s Department**  
15 **of Environmental Services, and declaring an emergency.**

16  
17 WHEREAS, the Village of Reminderville (“Reminderville”) is located within the  
18 Summit County Metropolitan Sewer District and the County currently provides sanitary sewer  
19 service to the Village of Reminderville through its Waste Water Treatment Plant No. 29  
20 (“WWTP No. 29”); and

21  
22 WHEREAS, WWTP No. 29 is a relatively expensive plant to operate and maintain  
23 compared to the County’s other large waste water treatment plants; and

24  
25 WHEREAS, WWTP No. 29 is aging, and there are further residential developments  
26 expected in its service area that will require substantial capital improvements to expand the plant,  
27 keep it operational and in compliance with Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”)  
28 requirements; and

29  
30 WHEREAS, the Executive’s Department of Environmental Services (“DOES”) has  
31 determined that it is more cost effective to abandon WWTP No. 29 and connect the area serviced  
32 by WWTP No. 29 to Twinsburg’s sanitary sewer system for treatment and disposal; and

34 WHEREAS, Twinsburg is willing to sell capacity in its waste water treatment plant to the  
35 County, and thereby treat and dispose of sanitary sewer wastes from WWTP No. 29’s service  
36 area located in and around the Reminderville; and

37  
38 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information,  
39 that authorizing the County Executive to execute the Reminderville Sanitary Sewer Service  
40 Agreement between Twinsburg and the County, substantially in the form attached to this  
41 Resolution as Exhibit A, is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit;

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43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State  
44 of Ohio, that;

46 SECTION 1

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48 The County Executive is authorized to execute the Reminderville Sanitary Sewer Service  
49 Agreement between the City of Twinsburg (“Twinsburg”) and the County, substantially in the  
50 form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A, in which the County shall purchase 650,000  
51 gallons per day capacity in Twinsburg’s waste water treatment plant for an amount not to exceed

4 SECTION 1 (cont'd.)

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6 \$1,900,000.00; send sanitary sewer flow from the Reminderville Service Area to Twinsburg for  
7 treatment and disposal; proportionately participate in capital projects in Twinsburg's waste water  
8 treatment plant; and shall quarterly pay Twinsburg's flat residential sewer rate multiplied by a  
9 factor of 1.5 for each single family equivalent in the Reminderville Service Area, for a term of  
10 25 years.

11  
12 SECTION 2

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14 This Resolution is declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare  
15 of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason that it allows the County to  
16 immediately realize cost savings, continue to provide the Village of Reminderville with sanitary  
17 sewer service and comply with Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") requirements.

19 SECTION 3


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21 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take  
22 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take  
23 effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.
