A Resolution authorizing the Executive to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Peninsula concerning the repair and relocation of Akron-Peninsula Road, located in the Village of Peninsula, in Council District 1, for the Executive and Engineer, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Village of Peninsula closed Akron-Peninsula Road approximately 0.37 miles north of Truxell Road due to a road slope failure causing the pavement to crack and slide into the Cuyahoga River; and

WHEREAS, while Akron-Peninsula Road between Truxell and State Route 303 is owned and maintained by the Village of Peninsula, the Village has a population of just under 600 people a small staff and an insufficient operating budget to administer or fund a landslide repair project; and

WHEREAS, Akron-Peninsula Road is critical for the County of Summit, local residents, Cuyahoga Valley National Park, and Blossom Music Center; and

WHEREAS, the Executive and Engineer's Office offered aid in identifying and applying for grant funding on behalf of the Village of Peninsula; and

WHEREAS, the Engineer's Office, on behalf of the Village of Peninsula, successfully applied for \$1,000,000.00 in emergency funding from the Ohio Public Works Commission; and

WHEREAS, the current plan calls for the relocation of approximately 1,600 feet of Akron-Peninsula Road 25 feet to the east, river debris removal, and embankment stabilization (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County agrees to cover the 10% local match with the current understanding that Federal American Rescue Plan 2021 set aside funds for counties with a significant portion of federal lands may be used for any government function, including road repair and maintenance, and where initial funding may come from the County; and

WHEREAS, the current estimate for the Project is \$1,214,384.18 with the Ohio Public Works Commission providing up to \$1,000,000.00 with the local share being estimated to be \$214,384.18; and

WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement is needed to outline the financial responsibilities and other duties for the County of Summit and the Village of Peninsula. The County's duties will include administering the Project from the bidding process for design and construction contracting through supervising and inspecting the construction to its completion and the Village retains road ownership and remains responsible for all future maintenance of Akron-Peninsula Road at this location upon completion of the Project, as detailed in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined by reviewing all pertinent information that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the Executive to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Peninsula for the aforementioned Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that;

## SECTION 1

The Executive is hereby authorized to execute an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Peninsula to outline responsibilities and financial contributions for the Akron-Peninsula Road Landslide Repair Project. The final agreement will be substantially in the form the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein as if fully restated.

## **SECTION 2**

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further purpose to immediately allow the Executive to execute said agreement and allow the Village of Peninsula, the Executive and the Engineer to proceed with a project to reopen a valuable roadway in Summit County as expeditiously as possible.

## SECTION 3

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.
