7 **A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute agreements and extensions to**
8 **existing agreements with various local employers for participation and reimbursement**
9 **through the Subsidized Employment Program, for the period 7/1/12 through 9/30/12,**
10 **utilizing formulary Temporary Assistance to Needy Families funds, in an amount not to**
11 **exceed \$215,000.00, for the Executive's Department of Job and Family Services, and**
12 **declaring an emergency.**

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14 WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2011-367, this Council authorized the County
15 Executive to execute agreements and extensions to existing agreements with various employers
16 for participation and reimbursement through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
17 Subsidized Employment Program ("TANF SEP"), in an amount not to exceed \$650,000.00
18 collectively, for the period 6/1/11 through 6/30/12; and

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20 WHEREAS, following said approval, the County has entered into new SEP agreements
21 and extensions to existing agreements with several employers whereby those employers will be
22 reimbursed out of TANF SEP funds for expenses incurred due to newly hired employees; and

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24 WHEREAS, it is necessary to extend the deadline for the expenditure of said TANF SEP
25 funds from 6/30/12 to 9/30/12 and to allow the execution of new agreements and extensions of
26 existing agreements during that time to ensure that all funds allocated for the SEP program are
27 committed and expended through the aforementioned SEP agreements; and

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29 WHEREAS, the Executive's Department of Job and Family Services anticipates that
30 approximately \$215,000.00 of the original \$650,000.00 authorized pursuant to Resolution No.
31 2011-367 will be available on 6/30/12 to be spent in the extension period of 6/30/12 through
32 9/30/12; and

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34 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information,
35 that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to authorize the Executive to execute
36 SEP agreements and extensions to existing agreements with various employers for participation
37 and reimbursement through the SEP program, in an amount not to exceed \$215,000.00
38 collectively, for the period 7/1/12 through 9/30/12;

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40 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit,
41 State of Ohio, that:

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43 SECTION 1

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45 The County Executive is hereby authorized to execute Subsidized Employment Program
46 ("SEP") agreements and extensions to existing agreements with various employers for
47 participation and reimbursement through the SEP program, in an amount not to exceed
48 \$215,000.00 collectively, for the period 7/1/12 through 9/30/12.

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6 This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency in the interest of the health, safety
7 and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further reason that it is necessary
8 to immediately authorize the Executive to timely expend said funds prior to the close of the
9 federal fiscal year on 9/30/12.

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11 SECTION 3

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13 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take
14 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise it shall take effect
15 and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

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17 SECTION 4

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19 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating
20 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all
21 deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in
22 meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121 .22 of
23 the Ohio Revised Code.
