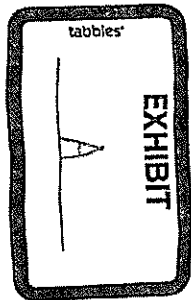


**SUMMIT COUNTY JUVENILE COURT
FY10 PROGRAM FUNDING**

Shelter Care	Safe Landing Youth Shelters serve both boys and girls and provides short-term crisis residential care. Stay ranges from few hours to three weeks.	137,750.00
Summit County Cluster for Youth	Cluster is composed of Juvenile Court, CSB, MRDD, ADM, and ODYS. Agencies pool resources in order to secure residential placements for children involved with multiple agencies. Children may or may not remain in the custody of a parent during placement.	100,000.00
Shelter Care	Youth Assessment Program provides a group home setting for up to 90 days for children charged with or adjudicated on a sexual offense.	98,550.00
Various	Long term placements provide a wide range of services and care for troubled youth when it is contrary to their best interests to remain in their home. Children can be placed in either open and locked settings. Service covers a variety of issues depending on child's needs. Most placements last anywhere from 9-16 months.	450,000.00

Summit County Sheriff	Part time security for evening crossroads court.	20,000.00
Community Health Center	Community Health Center regularly conducts urinalysis screens that provide objective data on the current status of the youth's substance abuse.	32,000.00
Akron Health Department	Provides initial substance abuse screening for youth held in detention	55,346.00
Child Guidance	A Court mental health liaison facilitates referrals from Juvenile Court and monitors them through a screening process and into treatment at Child Guidance. The liaison is available to staff and judiciary for each child experiencing mental health problems.	25,000.00
Child Guidance	Crossroads youth with co-occurring substance abuse/dependence and mental health diagnosis may receive integrated co-occurring treatment (ICT) services. The advantage of this treatment modality is that one counselor works with the youth and family on both the substance abuse/dependence and the mental health disorder. The services are delivered in the community, i.e., home and school, and involve individual sessions with the youth and family sessions. The counselor provides case management services	70,000.00
