WHEREAS, County Council has determined by reviewing all pertinent information that the aforementioned contracts are necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The award by the Board of Control of various professional service contracts, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten, to provide State Fiscal Year 2010 Delinquent Care and Custody RECLAIM Grant services, for the period 7/1/09 through 6/30/10, for a total amount not to exceed \$1,017,646.00, is hereby confirmed, and the County Executive is authorized to execute such contracts.

SECTION 2

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason to immediately provide State Fiscal Year 2010 Delinquent Care and Custody RECLAIM Grant services.
