 A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute, as part of the County's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, a General Fund grant agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00 and a Community Development Block Grant Fund Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00, both with the Western Reserve Community Fund, Inc. ("WRCF"), to fund its Minority Contractors Capital Access Program ("MCCAP"), authorizing the County Executive to execute a loan agreement with WRCF in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 to finance costs related to the MCCAP, for the Executive's Department of Community and Economic Development, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, even prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, research, data and several local initiatives, including *Elevate Greater Akron* and The Fund for Our Economic Future's *The Two Tomorrows* report, documented the severe disparity between small minority-owned, womenowned, veteran-owned, LGBTQ-owned and disabled-owned businesses (collectively "minority-owned businesses") compared to other small businesses; and

WHEREAS, such disparity between minority-owned businesses and other small businesses includes, but is not limited to, far-fewer minority-owned businesses compared to the demographics of the general population, far less entrepreneurial activity, and substantially more difficulty accessing business capital; and

WHEREAS, the disparity between minority-owned businesses and other small businesses is particularly severe in the construction industry and related industries such as engineering, design, architectural, landscaping, snow removal, environmental; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has devastated small businesses in Summit County, and early research nationwide indicates that minority-owned businesses will be especially hit by the economic fallout from the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, as a result, it is safe to conclude that the COVID-19 pandemic will only worsen the disparity between minority-owned businesses and other small businesses; and

WHEREAS, it is also likely that the national approach to recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic will include some amount of development and/or infrastructure funding, as evidenced by (i) the inclusion of an additional \$1.5 Billion in funding for the Economic Development Administration in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act, (ii) comments by both the President of the United States, his administration and members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, and (iii) the historical tendency of the country to respond to economic crisis through increased funding for infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons stated above, it is highly likely that minority-owned businesses will further miss out on the opportunity to meaningfully participate in recovery efforts brought about through development and infrastructure funding, thereby only increasing the disparity of those contractors compared to their non-minority counterparts; and

 WHEREAS, in the aftermath of the 2008-2009 economic crisis, access to capital was substantially reduced in general, and in particular for small minority-owned businesses, and the worsening economic conditions due to the COVID-19 pandemic could lead to a repeat of that issue; and

WHEREAS, the County, City of Akron ("City"), Development Finance Authority of Summit County ("DFA") and Western Reserve Community Fund, Inc. ("WRCF") have developed the Minority Contractors Capital Access Program ("MCCAP") to assist small minority-owned, businesses engaged in construction, engineering, design, architectural, landscaping, snow removal, environmental, and similar industries, with obtaining access to capital to finance projected-related bonding, material and labor costs; and

WHEREAS, in developing MCCAP, the County, City, DFA and WRCF intend to utilize it as a tool to assist minority-owned businesses recovering from the negative effects of the COVID-19 pandemic through overcoming barriers to capital for their businesses and increasing the number of minority-owned businesses involved in public and private construction and similar projects; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the Board of WRCF will adopt program guidelines and other necessary documents to create the MCCAP later in May 2020; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive desires to execute a grant agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00 to be paid from the County's General Fund and a Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") Fund Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00, both with WRCF, to provide funding for MCCAP; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the funds provided by the County, the City intends to enter into an agreement with WRCF hereby it will provide WRCF an additional \$125,000 in CDBG funds for the MCCAP; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide WRCF with sufficient cash to provide funding for credit facilities extended to minority-owned businesses under the MCCAP, the Executive wishes to execute a loan agreement with WRCF in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00, the proceeds of which shall be used by WRCF to provide funding under the MCCAP; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to authorize the County Executive to execute the aforementioned agreements, and to appropriate funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

### **SECTION 1**

This Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to execute a grant agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00 with the Western Reserve Community Fund, Inc. ("WRCF") to be paid from the County's General Fund, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, to provide funding for its Minority Contractors Capital Access Program ("MCCAP").

# **SECTION 2**

This Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to execute a Community Development Block Grant Fund Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$125,000.00 with WRCF, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference, to provide funding for the MCCAP.

### **SECTION 3**

This Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to execute a loan agreement with WRCF in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00, the proceeds of which shall be used by WRCF to provide funding under the MCCAP to minority-owned businesses, as set forth in Exhibit C, attached to this Resolution and incorporated herein as if fully restated.

### **SECTION 4**

This Resolution is declared to be an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit and for the further reason to immediately authorize the County's financial contributions to the MCCAP to assist small minority-owned businesses, as a result of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **SECTION 5**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

# **SECTION 6**

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
