Scope of Problem & Need Statement:

With the national increase in drug use specifically opiates frequent observed drug testing is a vital-tool-to-utilize-in-the-probation-setting. According to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health, "In 2007-2008, Ohio was one of the top ten states for rates in several drug-use categories, including: past-year non-medical use of pain relievers among young adults age 18 to 25, and illicit drug dependence among young adults age 18 to 25" National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 2007-2008." With this sharp and steady increase in illicit drug use community corrections are in need of providing urine drug testing services to monitor compliance in the clients. According to a white paper published by the American Society of Addiction Medicine, community corrections should utilize frequent drug testing, which has been indicated to significantly reduce drug use, criminal recidivism and incarceration (American Society for Addiction Medicine, 2013, p. 81). The use of observed drug tests is the standard in probation and parole offices. Within the Bureau of Justice Assistance: American Probation and Parole's Association Drug Drug Testing Guidelines and Practices it states, "the collection personnel will directly and continuously observe urine passing from the offender into the specimen container" (Bureau of Justice Assistance, 1991).

Proposal:

In order to provide urine drug screening services to the clients of the Adult Probation Department, the department wishes to enter into a contract with a local agency that provides these services. Funding for these services will come through the Ohio Smart Grant Probation Funding imitative through the Ohio Department of Corrections and through the use of Supervision Fees. An outline of the services sought will be highlighted in the exhibits.

The Adult Probation Department researched several agencies in the local community that can provide observed urine drug screening.

Agency A:

Community Health Center, Inc. 725 East Market St, Akron OH 44305

The Community Health Center provides <u>Observed Urine Drug Screens</u> on a daily basis and has hours that are flexible to meet the needs of the individuals served by the Adult Probation Department.

The Community Health Center holds several certifications for their testing services including,

- Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA)
- Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO)
- Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (ODMHAS).
