1	WHEREAS, federal regulations require ABAWDS between the ages of 18 and 49 to
2	fulfill a work requirement to receive even the most basic food assistance for more than three
3	months in a thirty-six month period; and

6	granted states a waiver to the work requirement; and

8	WHEREAS, Governor John Kasich recently made the decision to not renew the waiver

WHEREAS, the current financial allocation from the State of Ohio to Summit County to assess ABAWDS and administer the work program is negligible and presents hardships to the County as it attempts to assist ABAWDS find employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of this Council, to oppose the Governor's decision to not request the waiver of the work requirement for SNAP food assistance benefits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

This Council hereby opposes the decision made by Governor John Kasich to not renew the federal waiver of the work requirement provision of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program given the impact such a decision will have on thousands receiving basic food assistance in Summit County and the detrimental effect the decision will have on the local economy, in particular both large and small grocery businesses.

SECTION 2

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further purpose to immediately oppose the decision made by Governor John Kasich to not renew the federal waiver of the work requirement provision of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

SECTION 3

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 4

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
