RESOLUTION NO

A Resolution confirming the award by the Board of Control of a purchase contract with Matrix Pointe Software, LLC, at State Term Pricing, subject to the approval of the Information Technology Board, for the Matrix Case Management system, data conversion for the County Prosecutor's Office, and one-year of subscription license fees, for a total amount not to exceed \$364,200.00, and appropriating funds, for the Office of Information Technology and the Prosecutor, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the County and the Cities of Akron, Barberton, Cuyahoga Falls, Stow and Tallmadge are currently managing their criminal case loads by various means; and

WHEREAS, by cooperating to purchase and implement a coordinated case management system, each jurisdiction will be better able to manage its case load in addition to being able to transfer cases up to the County level upon indictment without additional data entry; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Control, at its meeting held June 14, 2017, awarded a purchase contract with Matrix Pointe Software, LLC, at State Term Pricing, subject to the approval of the Information Technology Board, for the Matrix Case Management system, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, data conversion for the County Prosecutor's Office, in an amount not to exceed \$22,200.00, and one-year of subscription license fees, in an amount not to exceed \$16,000.00 per month, for an amount not to exceed \$192,000.00 for a one-year period, for a total amount not to exceed \$364,200.00, subject to confirmation by County Council; and

WHEREAS, currently pending before this Council is a Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute an intergovernmental agreement with the Cities of Akron, Barberton, Cuyahoga Falls, Stow and Tallmadge to share in the cost of the purchase of the Matrix Case Management system and the subscription license fees; and

WHEREAS, the County Prosecutor's office will use \$148,161.00 from its Federal Fiscal Year 2017 Victims of Crime Act grant to support the implementation of the software, it is also necessary to appropriate funds for the remainder of the purchase, data conversion and one-year subscription license fees for the Matrix Case Management system and related costs; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that the aforementioned purchase contract with Matrix Pointe Software, LLC is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

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SECTION 1

The award by the Board of Control of a purchase contract with Matrix Pointe Software. LLC, at State Term Pricing, subject to the approval of the Information Technology Board, for the Matrix Case Management system, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, data conversion for the County Prosecutor's Office, in an amount not to exceed \$22,200.00, and one-year of subscription license fees, in an amount not to exceed \$16,000.00 per month, for an amount not to exceed \$192,000.00 for a one-year period, for a total amount not to exceed \$364,200.00, is hereby confirmed and the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute such purchase contract and any related necessary documents.

SECTION 4

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason to immediately provide a needed case management system for the Prosecutor's Office and the Cities of Akron, Barberton, Cuyahoga Falls, Stow and Tallmadge and to immediately appropriate funds for said purpose.

SECTION 5

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.
