An Ordinance amending Chapter 372 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, entitled "Pedestrian or Vehicle Interference," to settle a lawsuit, <u>Wilson v. Bath Township</u>, et al., for the Executive, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the County of Summit derives its home rule powers from Section 3, Article X, of the Ohio Constitution, which allows a county to adopt a charter which may provide for the "concurrent or exclusive exercise by the county, in all or part of its area, of all or any designated powers vested by the Constitution or laws of Ohio in municipalities"; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 1.01 of the County Charter authorizes the County to concurrently exercise municipal powers as well as any powers granted to counties under the Ohio Revised Code, therefore providing the county the ability to exercise the home rule powers of a municipality within its territory where there is no conflict with a municipality or township's exercise of the powers granted to them by the Ohio Constitution or general law; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the safety on highways in Ohio communities, Ohio municipalities such as the City of Columbus have enacted ordinances to prohibit certain actions that interfere with the safety of pedestrians and vehicles on said highways; and

WHEREAS, in order to address said safety issues, County Council adopted Amended Ordinance No. 2018-521, which enacted Chapter 372 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, entitled "Pedestrian or Vehicle Interference," to prohibit certain types of actions that interfere with the safety of pedestrians and vehicles on highways within the County's townships; and

WHEREAS, Leon Wilson subsequently file a lawsuit, Wilson v. Bath Township, et al., Civil Action No: 5:19-cv-156, before Judge R. Adams in the U.S. District Court Northern District of Ohio against Bath Township, the County and Vito Sinopoli, Bath Township's Law Director, declaring Chapter 372 as a violation of Mr. Wilson's First Amendment rights and seeking to block enforcement of Chapter 372 (the "Lawsuit"); and

WHEREAS, in order to settle the Lawsuit, the County will agree to pay \$2,000.00 and to amend Chapter 372 to conform with the First Amendment; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to amend Chapter 372 for the aforementioned reason;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:
