An Amended Resolution declaring it necessary to levy a tax outside the ten-mill limitation in order to provide sufficient funds to the Akron Zoological Park to maintain and operate existing facilities and to expand physical facilities and educational programs in order to continue to provide zoological park services and facilities at the Akron Zoo, to develop the Akron Zoo, and to provide for the acquisition, disposition and care of animals to be exhibited at the Akron Zoo, by the renewal of an existing tax levy of eight-tenths (0.8) of a mill with an increase of four-tenths (0.4) of a mill, to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills, for a duration of ten years, and requesting the County Fiscal Officer to certify to the County Council the total current tax valuation of the County and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed tax levy for the Executive and Council and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Council of the County of Summit ("Council") is the taxing authority of the County pursuant to Article III, Section 3.01 of the County Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Akron Zoological Park, a nonprofit corporation, operates and maintains a zoological park in the County (the "Akron Zoo"); and

WHEREAS, Section 307.76 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the County to contract with or contribute to a nonprofit corporation to maintain, and operate and develop a zoological park in the County and to provide for the acquisition, disposition, and care of animals to be exhibited at the zoological park, and the County has entered into an agreement with the Akron Zoological Park for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the electors of Summit County on November 5, 2013 approved the renewal of an eight-tenths (0.8) of a mill tax levy, for operating and capital expenses for the provision of zoological park services and facilities at the Akron Zoo; and

WHEREAS, the authority to levy aforesaid tax expires with the levy heretofore made on the 2020 tax duplicate for distribution to the County in 2021; and

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation and the existing tax levy will be insufficient for the aforesaid purpose, and it is necessary to renew and increase by four-tenths (0.4) of a mill the one-eighth (0.8) of a mill levy to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 5705.19 and 5705.191; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Akron Zoological Park has recommended to the County that this Council place upon the ballot at the <u>primary general</u> election on <u>March 17Novenber 3</u>, 2020 the question of the renewal of a tax levy of eight-tenths (0.8) of a mills and increase of four-tenths (0.4) of a mill, to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills, for the aforesaid purpose, to run for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the 2021 tax list and duplicate, for collection in the years 2022 through 2031 inclusive; and

WHEREAS in accordance with Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code as amended by Amended Substitute House Bill 166, effective July 18, 2019, upon receipt of a certified copy of a resolution of this Council declaring the necessity of a tax, (a) stating its purpose, (b) whether

it is an additional levy, a renewal, or a replacement of an existing tax, or the renewal or replacement of an existing tax with an increase or a decrease, (c) the Section of the Revised Code authorizing the submission of the question of the tax, (d) the term of years of the tax (or that it is for a continuing period of time), (e) that the tax is to be levied upon the entire territory of the County, (f) the date of the election at which the question of the tax shall appear on the ballot, (g) that the ballot measure shall be submitted to the entire territory of the County, (h) the tax year in which the tax will first be levied and the calendar year in which it will be first collected, and requesting such certification, the County Fiscal Officer is to certify the (1) total current tax valuation of the County; and (2) dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the specified number of mills; and

 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to declare the necessity of renewing the aforementioned tax levy of eight-tenths (0.8) of a mill and providing for an increase of four-tenths (0.4) of a mill, to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills for the Akron Zoological Park, to increase the duration of the levy to ten years from seven years and to certify this Resolution to the Fiscal Officer requesting that she certify to the taxing authority the total current tax valuation of the County, and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the aforementioned renewal and increase tax levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, two-thirds of all the members elected thereto concurring, that:

SECTION 1

It is necessary to levy a tax outside the ten-mill limitation in order to provide necessary funds to the Akron Zoological Park to maintain and operate the Akron Zoo, to develop the Akron Zoo, and to provide for the acquisition, disposition and care of animals to be exhibited at the Akron Zoo, by the renewal of the existing tax levy of eight-tenths (0.8) of a mill with an increase in the levy of four-tenths (0.4) of a mill, to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills, for a period of ten (10) years commencing with the tax duplicate of 2021 for collection in the years 2022 through 2031, inclusive, to maintain and operate existing facilities and to expand physical facilities and educational programs in order to continue to provide zoological park services and facilities at the Akron Zoological Park, and that this Council intends to submit the question of the proposed renewal and increase of that levy to electors of the entire territory of the County, and only the territory of the County, at an election on March 17 November 3, 2020, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 5705.19 and 5705.191.

SECTION 2

In accordance with Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council authorizes and requests the Clerk of Council to certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Fiscal Officer for calculation of the total current tax valuation of the County and for calculation of the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the aforesaid renewal levy of eight-tenths (0.8) of mill with an increase of four-tenths of (0.4) tents of a mill to constitute a tax levy of one and two-tenths (1.2) mills. This Council requests the County Fiscal Officer to thereupon certify to it both (i) the total current tax valuation of the County, and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the aforesaid renewal levy of one-eighth (0.8) with an increase of four-tenths (0.4) at a rate not to exceed one and two-tenths (1.2) mills.
