A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute any documents necessary to apply for Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant funds and Transportation Alternatives Set Aside funds, programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study, in order to improve eleven projects in Council Districts 1, 3, 4, 5, and 8, for the Engineer and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study ("AMATS") has issued a notification seeking grant applications for projects eligible to receive Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant ("STBG") funds and Transportation Alternatives Set Aside ("TASA") funds; and

WHEREAS, the County Engineer has identified eleven different projects in Council Districts 1, 3, 4, 5, and 8 that meet AMATS project criteria and guidelines, with project names and descriptions attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A, and intends to be the lead applicant for AMATS funding for these projects; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore intends to be the lead applicant in the Gilchrist Road Resurfacing Project, in Council District 8, and has requested that the County serve as a coapplicant of the same; and

WHEREAS, the federal programs will provide up to 80% of the construction costs for the projects;

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the County Executive to execute any documents necessary to apply for STBG and TASA funds programmed by AMATS to improve eleven projects in Council Districts 1, 3, 4, 5, and 8;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:
