NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

## SECTION 1

Effective July 1, 2019, Section 537.14 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, entitled "Illegal Distribution of Cigarettes, Electronic Smoking Devices, Tobacco Products, or Tobacco Product Paraphernalia," is hereby amended as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

## **SECTION 2**

This Ordinance is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further reason that it will immediately, upon the effective date, prohibit the sale of cigarettes, electronic smoking devices, tobacco products or tobacco product paraphernalia to persons under the age of twenty-one in order to improve the health of those individuals.

## **SECTION 3**

Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

## **SECTION 4**

**EXECUTIVE** 

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
