A Resolution urging the United States House of Representatives, United States Senate and the President of the United States to enter into a compromise relative to the current budget impasse and for Congress to pass a complete budget with the purpose of immediately ending the partial shutdown of the Federal Government, for the Executive and Council, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution of the United States, Congress has a responsibility to adopt a budget to fund the Federal Government, including funding duly enacted and constitutional laws and operations; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the failure to fully adopt a budget, the Federal Government has been partially shut down other than mandatory spending; and

WHEREAS, due to the partial shutdown of the Federal Government, approximately 380,000 federal employees have been placed on unpaid leave, while some 420,000 essential personnel have been required to work without pay; and

WHEREAS, the families of these federal workers are being negatively financially impacted at a time when it is increasingly difficult for struggling families to make ends meet; and

WHEREAS, under the partial shutdown, the National Park Service is operating with limited staff and is providing no visitor services such as toilets, facility and road maintenance and trash collection; and

WHEREAS, under the partial shutdown, the Internal Revenue Service has sent home almost 90 percent of its staff without pay which could result in the delay of over \$140 billion in tax refunds reaching U.S. households; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to urge the United States House of Representatives, United States Senate and the President of the United States to enter into a compromise relative to the current budget impasse and for Congress to pass a complete budget with the purpose of immediately ending the partial shutdown of the Federal Government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

## SECTION 1

 This Council hereby urges the United States House of Representatives, United States Senate and the President of the United States to enter into a compromise relative to the current budget impasse and for Congress to pass a full budget with the purpose of immediately ending the partial shutdown of the Federal Government.

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#### **SECTION 2**

The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to President Donald Trump, U.S. Senators Sherrod Brown and Rob Portman, and all members of the U.S. House of Representatives representing a portion of Summit County.

#### **SECTION 3**

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reason of immediately urging Congress to adopt a full budget and end the partial shutdown of the Federal Government and stopping it's negative consequences.

#### **SECTION 4**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

### **SECTION 5**

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
