Those in counties designated as Red Alert Level 3 or Purple Alert Level 4 are required to wear a face covering: 8 9 • In any indoor location that is not a residence; 10 When outdoors and unable to consistently maintain a distance of six feet or more • from individuals who are not members of their household; or 11 12 • While waiting for, riding, driving, or operating public transportation, a taxi, a 13 private car service, or a ride-sharing vehicle. 14 WHEREAS, on July 9, 2020, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine increased the Risk Level for Summit County to Alert Level 3-Red as a result of the increase in the number of new 15 cases per capita, sustained increase in new cases, the proportion of cases not resulting from 16 17 congregate housing and a sustained increase in outpatient visits; and 18 WHEREAS, the transmission of COVID-19 through community spread remains a significant threat to the health and safety of the Summit County community as rates of 19 20 infection continue to increase despite efforts to control the spread of COVID-19; and 21 WHEREAS, the CDC recommends the use of face covers based on the role respiratory 22 droplets play in the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19, paired with emerging 23 evidence from clinical and laboratory studies; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the requirement that face coverings be worn by any person in a public place within Summit County best promotes health, safety, and welfare of the public by 26 reducing the spread of COVID-19 while enabling the continuation of essential services, 27 businesses, and travel necessary to protect public health and safety, and for the continuity of 28 social and commercial life during the state of emergency; and 29 30 WHERAS, the Executive and this Council believe that it is the civic and patriotic duty of those engaged in public activity in Summit County to protect the health and welfare of its 31 32 residents and visitors to the County by wearing face coverings in Summit County, beginning at 33 Alert Level 2 – Orange and thus desire to define the requirements for wearing a face covering when in public; and 34 35 WHEREAS, this Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the County's authority set forth in Article I, Sections 1.01 and 1.02 of the County of Summit Charter, and will apply in the 36 37 Townships within the County, but may also be adopted by its cities and villages; 38 39 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the County of Summit, State 40 of Ohio that: 41 42
