7 **A Resolution authorizing the Executive to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with**
8 **the Village of Peninsula concerning the repair and relocation of Akron-Peninsula Road,**
9 **located in the Village of Peninsula, in Council District 1, for the Executive and Engineer,**
10 **and declaring an emergency.**

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12 WHEREAS, the Village of Peninsula closed Akron-Peninsula Road approximately 0.37
13 miles north of Truxell Road due to a road slope failure causing the pavement to crack and slide
14 into the Cuyahoga River; and

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16 WHEREAS, while Akron-Peninsula Road between Truxell and State Route 303 is owned
17 and maintained by the Village of Peninsula, the Village has a population of just under 600 people
18 a small staff and an insufficient operating budget to administer or fund a landslide repair project;
19 and

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21 WHEREAS, Akron-Peninsula Road is critical for the County of Summit, local residents,
22 Cuyahoga Valley National Park, and Blossom Music Center; and

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24 WHEREAS, the Executive and Engineer's Office offered aid in identifying and applying
25 for grant funding on behalf of the Village of Peninsula; and

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27 WHEREAS, the Engineer's Office, on behalf of the Village of Peninsula, successfully
28 applied for \$1,000,000.00 in emergency funding from the Ohio Public Works Commission; and

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30 WHEREAS, the current plan calls for the relocation of approximately 1,600 feet of
31 Akron-Peninsula Road 25 feet to the east, river debris removal, and embankment stabilization
32 (the "Project"); and

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34 WHEREAS, the County agrees to cover the 10% local match with the current
35 understanding that Federal American Rescue Plan 2021 set aside funds for counties with a
36 significant portion of federal lands may be used for any government function, including road
37 repair and maintenance, and where initial funding may come from the County; and

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39 WHEREAS, the current estimate for the Project is \$1,214,384.18 with the Ohio Public
40 Works Commission providing up to \$1,000,000.00 with the local share being estimated to be
41 \$214,384.18; and

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43 WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement is needed to outline the financial
44 responsibilities and other duties for the County of Summit and the Village of Peninsula. The
45 County's duties will include administering the Project from the bidding process for design and
46 construction contracting through supervising and inspecting the construction to its completion
47 and the Village retains road ownership and remains responsible for all future maintenance of
48 Akron-Peninsula Road at this location upon completion of the Project, as detailed in Exhibit A;

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4 WHEREAS, this Council has determined by reviewing all pertinent information that it is
5 necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the Executive to enter
6 into an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Peninsula for the aforementioned
7 Project;

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9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State
10 of Ohio, that;

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12 SECTION 1

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14 The Executive is hereby authorized to execute an intergovernmental agreement with the
15 Village of Peninsula to outline responsibilities and financial contributions for the Akron-
16 Peninsula Road Landslide Repair Project. The final agreement will be substantially in the form
17 the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein as if fully restated.

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19 SECTION 2

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21 This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and
22 welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further purpose to immediately
23 allow the Executive to execute said agreement and allow the Village of Peninsula, the Executive
24 and the Engineer to proceed with a project to reopen a valuable roadway in Summit County as
25 expeditiously as possible.

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27 SECTION 3

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29 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take
30 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take
31 effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

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33 SECTION 4

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35 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating
36 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all
37 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,
38 were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section
39 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


