An <u>Amended</u> Resolution authorizing a professional service contract, subject to an award by the Board of Control, with Environmental Design Group, LLC, to perform consulting services in the planning of the expansion of broadband services into opportunity zones and job hub areas, ratifying acceptance of an EDA Cares Act grant and authorizing the required cash match for the Executive, <u>in an amount not to exceed \$290,481.00</u>, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, the President signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, ("ARPA") section 9901, Pub.LNo.117-2 codified at 42 U.S.C. section 802 et seq., providing funds to support state, local and tribal governments in responding to the continuing and evolving impact of COVID-19 on their communities; and

WHEREAS, ARPA provides funds to support projects which bring affordable high speed symmetrical broadband service of at least 100Mbps into unserved and underserved areas and to prioritize investments in fiber optic infrastructure where feasible, consistent with current FCC benchmarks and further encourages the participation of networks owned, operated by or affiliated with local governments and cooperatives, because they do not succumb to the pressure of the profit motive; and

WHEREAS, many residents in Summit County live in areas that qualify as unserved or underserved under the terms of ARPA and these residents continue to struggle from the effects of COVID-19 in terms of employment, financial strain and educational deficits and would thus benefit from affordable highspeed symmetrical broadband service in further working to recover from the effects of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Executive recognizes the need to address this digital divide in economically distressed areas of the County (Opportunity Zones), as well as providing critical infrastructure to areas of concentrated economic activity with the County (Job Hubs) in order to expand economic development and bring together job seekers and employers; and

WHEREAS, in order to support this critical development for the County's residents and economy, the Executive applied for funds from the US Department of Commerce through an EDA Cares Act grant and was awarded \$125,000 with a local match of \$143,200.00 \$165,481.00 in a combination of cash and in-kind services, for the purpose of examining the feasibility of expanding such service and maximizing the effectiveness of the County's investment and ultimately implementing that service; and

WHEREAS, in order to further support this critical development for the County's residents and economy, the Executive solicited proposals for planning and engineering services in the analysis of work necessary, in accordance with the requirements of the ARPA interim final rule, to provide high speed, symmetrical broadband of at least 100 Mbps into Job Hubs and Opportunity Zones including fiber layout, cost and constructability of the project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, after analyzing the proposals submitted, the Executive recommends Environmental Design Group, LLC ("EDG") as the most qualified firm to provide these services to the County for the Project at a cost not to exceed \$290,481.00; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Control will consider the awarded of a professional services Agreement to EDG for services to the Project at its meeting to be held on September 22, 2021; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to ratify the Executive's execution of the grant agreement with the US Department of Commerce in the amount of \$125,000 and authorize the commitment of in-kind funds of \$143,200.00 \$165,481.00, to support examining the feasibility of expanding such service and maximizing the effectiveness of the County's investment and ultimately implementing high speed, symmetrical broadband of at least 100 Mbps pursuant to the Interim Final Rule; and

WHEREAS, this Council further finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information that, subject to the award of the Board of Control, the aforementioned professional service contract with EDG is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit in the furtherance of this project;

WHEREAS, this Council further finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that authorizing the professional service agreement with EDG in an amount not to exceed \$290,481.00 to provide Summit County Residents and businesses high speed, symmetrical broadband service of at least 100 Mbps is necessary due to the public health emergency created by the COVID-19 pandemic.;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

# **SECTION 1**

This Council, subject to the award of the Board of Control, authorizes a professional service agreement with Environmental Design Group, LLC, for planning and engineering services in the analysis of work necessary to expand FairlawnGig into Job Hubs and Opportunity Zones including fiber layout, cost and constructability of the project, at a cost not to exceed \$290,481.00 and the Executive is hereby authorized to execute said professional service agreement and any other necessary related documents.

## **SECTION 2**

This to Council ratifies the Executive's signature on a grant agreement executed with the US Department of Commerce to accept the EDA CARES Act grant and the expenditure of a cash match of up to \$143,200.00 \$165,481.00.

#### **SECTION 3**

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further reason to immediately ratify the acceptance of the EDA CARES Act grant and authorize the cash match in order to provide for necessary analysis of work necessary to bring high speed symmetrical broadband service to residents and businesses within Summit County's Job Hubs and Opportunity Zones.
