A Resolution authorizing the Executive to execute a Local Public Agency Agreement with the State of Ohio, a Memorandum of Understanding with Bath Township and any other documents necessary for the Cleveland-Massillon Road Sidewalk Project, located in Bath Township, in Council District 5, for an estimated total cost of \$650,000.00, with the Department of Transportation providing Transportation Alternative Set Aside funds up to \$520,000.00 to cover up to 80% of the Project costs, with Bath Township responsible for the local funds for the Project, and authorizing the Executive to advertise for bids for the Project, for the Executive and the Engineer, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Engineer applied for and received Transportation Alternative Set Aside federal grant funding, programmed through the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study, on behalf of Bath Township for the construction of a sidewalk along the west side Cleveland-Massillon Road (County Route 17) from State Route 18 to Springside Drive, including a pedestrian ramp on the northwest corner of the Springside Drive at Cleveland-Massillon Road intersection (the "Project") located in Bath Township, in Council District 5, Project Identification Number 112788; and

WHEREAS, the County, as sponsor of the grant application, and as an authorized Local Public Agency ("LPA") for the Ohio Department of Transportation's Local Let Process, will act as administrator for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the estimated total cost of the Project is \$650,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Federal Highway Administration funds have been awarded to the County in the form of a grant to cover up to 80% of the Project's costs, in an amount not to exceed \$520,00.00, with Bath Township responsible for local funds for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, through the Ohio Department of Transportation ("ODOT"), and the Executive wish to enter into an LPA Agreement to confirm the Project's costs and to designate the County as the lead agency for administration of the Project; and

WHEREAS, said LPA Agreement will provide (i) that the estimated cost of the Project is \$650,000.00, (ii) that ODOT shall provide to the County as the LPA up to 80% of eligible Project costs, in an amount not to exceed \$520,000.00 in Federal High Administration funds and (iii) that the County, as the LPA, will provide the remaining local funds necessary to pay for the Project's costs; and

WHEREAS, Sections 5501.03(c) and 5543.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, as well as Article II, Section 2.03(5) of the County of Summit Charter authorize execution of such LPA Agreements, subject to the approval of this Council; and

WHEREAS, a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is needed between the County and Bath Township to outline the scope of work and responsibilities of each party for the Project and to require Bath Township to provide local funds for the Project; and

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WHEREAS, Section 177.05 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit requires this Council's authorization for the Executive to advertise for bids; and

WHEREAS, the Executive further wishes to advertise for bids in preparation of the Project that will be bid at a later date for an estimated total cost not to exceed \$650,000.00; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the bid specifications will be provided to the Clerk of Council upon their availability; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the Executive to execute the aforementioned LPA Agreement with ODOT, the MOU with Bath Township and any other documents necessary for the Project and to advertise for bids for the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

## SECTION 1

The Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Local Public Agency ("LPA") Agreement with the State of Ohio, through the Department of Transportation ("ODOT"), for various roadway and intersection studies, Project Identification Number 115294 (the "Project"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated fully herein, with such modifications and revisions as shall be in furtherance of the provisions of said LPA Agreement and not substantially adverse to the County, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof by the Executive. The Executive is further authorized to execute any other documents necessary for the Project. Upon federal authorization from ODOT, the County may commence the administration of the Project, with the award of the Project subject to applicable Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit, said Ordinances requiring authorization of such an award by the Board of Control and/or Council.

# **SECTION 2**

The Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with Bath Township which outlines the scope of work and responsibilities for the County and Bath Township for the Project and requires Bath Township to provide local funds for of the Project, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated fully herein, with such modifications and revisions as shall be in furtherance of the provisions of said MOU and not substantially adverse to the County, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof by the Executive. The Executive is further authorized to execute any other documents necessary for the Project.

## **SECTION 3**

The Executive is hereby authorized to advertise for bids for the Project, for an estimated amount not to exceed \$650,000.00.

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### SECTION 4

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further reason that it immediately completes prerequisites to accept funds needed for a pedestrian safety project in Summit County.

## **SECTION 5**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.
