7 **A Resolution confirming the award by the Board of Control of Change Order No. 1 to a**  
8 **Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Agreement with Child Guidance and Family**  
9 **Solutions for intervention services for youth with behavioral problems, from 10/1/21**  
10 **through 9/30/22, in an amount not to exceed \$102,000.00, (for a cumulative increase of**  
11 **102%) for a total amount not to exceed \$202,000.00, for the Executive’s Department of Job**  
12 **and Family Services, and declaring an emergency.**

13  
14 WHEREAS, this Council previously adopted Resolution No, 2021-258, which authorized  
15 the Executive to execute a Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (“TANF”) Agreement with  
16 Child Guidance and Family Solutions for intervention services for youth with behavioral  
17 problems, from 10/1/21 through 9/30/22, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00; and

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19 WHEREAS, this agreement with Child Guidance and Family Solutions provides  
20 prevention and intervention services for preschool aged children who exhibit behavioral  
21 problems in a childcare setting, which could result in expulsion and inhibit parents’ ability to  
22 maintain employment. Agreement services include training for childcare providers, to identify  
23 children with behavioral problems and correct actions with intensive on-site support from a  
24 behavior specialist, and assessments for children to identify behavioral and/or mental health  
25 issues; and

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27 WHEREAS, due to increased client need for intervention services for youth with  
28 behavioral problems, the Executive’s Department of Job and Family Services wishes to amend  
29 its TANF Agreement with Child Guidance and Family Solutions; and

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31 WHEREAS, the Executive wishes to enter into Change Order No. 1 to the TANF  
32 Agreement with Child Guidance and Family Solutions to provide the aforementioned additional  
33 services; and

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35 WHEREAS, the Board of Control, at its meeting held May 18, 2022, awarded Change  
36 Order No. 1 to a TANF Agreement with Child Guidance and Family Solutions for intervention  
37 services for youth with behavioral problems, from 10/1/21 through 9/30/22, in an amount not to  
38 exceed \$102,000.00, (for a cumulative increase of 102%) for a total amount not to exceed  
39 \$202,000.00, subject to confirmation by this Council; and

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41 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information  
42 that the aforementioned Change Order No. 1 to a TANF Agreement with Child Guidance and  
43 Family Solutions is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit;

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45 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State  
46 of Ohio, that:

50 The award by the Board of Control of Change Order No. 1 to a Temporary Assistance to  
51 Needy Families (“TANF”) Agreement with Child Guidance and Family Solutions for  
52 intervention services for youth with behavioral problems, from 10/1/21 through 9/30/22, in an

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6 amount not to exceed \$102,000.00, (for a cumulative increase of 102%) for a total amount not to  
7 exceed \$202,000.00, is hereby confirmed and the Executive is hereby authorized to execute said  
8 change order and any other necessary related documents.

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10 SECTION 2

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12 This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and  
13 welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further reason to immediately  
14 confirm the award of a necessary change order to a TANF Agreement in order to immediately  
15 provide additional intervention services for youth with behavioral problems.

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17 SECTION 3

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19 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take  
20 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take  
21 effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

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23 SECTION 4

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25 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating  
26 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all  
27 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,  
28 were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section  
29 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
