A Resolution declaring the month of February 2023 as Black History Month in Summit County, recognizing the accomplishments made by Black Americans while facing incredible adversity throughout history, as well as acknowledging the challenges of the present, for the Council and the Executive, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the first Black History Month was proposed and celebrated by the faculty of the Center of Pan-African Culture and the members of Black United Students at Kent State University in 1970, conferring local significance to what would become a national event in 1976; and

WHEREAS, the Civil Rights Movement prompted historians and educators to expand the teaching of Black history as well as recognize the contributions of Black scientists, artists, educators, athletes, politicians, business people, religious and spiritual leaders, and countless others that reflect the greatness of the United States and Summit County; and

WHEREAS, current movements for racial justice and equality continue to press for the tenets of the Civil Rights Movement, such as equal treatment under the law, and increase awareness about black and brown identities; and

WHEREAS, mass protests in the wake of the murder of George Floyd at the hands of the Minneapolis police reignited calls for the prevention and prosecution of instances of police brutality against black and brown people in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Summit County joined state, county, and city governments across the county in declaring racism as a public health crisis to address how racism – not race – causes disproportionately high rates of homelessness, incarceration, poverty, poor education outcomes, and poor health outcomes in the Black community; and

WHEREAS, the Racism as a Public Health Crisis Special Review Committee has completed its report in 2022 and County officeholders will now use the recommendations to further remove systemic barriers contributing to racial inequities in County operations and provide a model for other communities looking to do the same; and

WHEREAS, there continues to be significant health disparities perpetuated by racism, such as disproportionately high mortality rates for Black mothers and infants during pregnancy and childbirth; and

WHEREAS, infant mortality rates among Black mothers stands twice as high than the state average at 13.6 per 1,000 for Black mothers compared to the average of 6.7 per 1,000 for Ohio mothers in 2020; and

WHEREAS, despite these disparities and others, there continues to also be strides toward equity and equality in the United States, including in representation at the highest level, such as the election of the first Black and Asian Vice-President, Kamala Harris, and appointment of the first Black Supreme Court Justice, Ketanji Brown Jackson; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit that February 2023 be declared Black History Month in Summit County, and encouraging the residents of Summit County to join in this acknowledgement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The month of February 2023 is hereby declared Black History Month in Summit County and the residents of Summit County are encouraged to join in this acknowledgement and recognize the role that racial diversity and inclusion plays in strengthening our community.

SECTION 2

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and employees of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately declaring February 2023 as Black History Month in Summit County.

SECTION 3

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 4

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
