7 **A Resolution confirming the award by the Board of Control of a renewal (first of three) of**  
8 **a purchase contract with Nesco Resource, LLC fka Callos Resource LLC, for payroll**  
9 **services for the period 10/1/23 through 9/30/24, for various youth employment programs,**  
10 **including summer youth and year-round programs, in an amount not to exceed**  
11 **\$1,395,638.10, for the Executive’s Department of Job and Family Services, and declaring**  
12 **an emergency.**

13

14 WHEREAS, this Council previously adopted Resolution No. 2022-145, which authorized  
15 the Executive to advertise for bids for payroll services for youth employment programs, for an  
16 estimated total cost not to exceed \$1,400,000.00; and

17

18 WHEREAS, this Council subsequently adopted Resolution No. 2022-297, which  
19 authorized the award by the Board of Control of a purchase contract with Nesco Resource, LLC  
20 fka Callos Resource LLC, for payroll services for the period 10/1/22 through 9/30/23, for various  
21 youth employment programs, including summer youth and year-round programs, with three  
22 options to renew for additional one-year terms, in an amount not to exceed \$1,395,683.95; and

23

24 WHEREAS, the renewal is in the amount not to exceed \$1,395,638.10, provided by  
25 Nesco Resource, LLC fka Callos Resource LLC (hereinafter “Nesco”) and the Executive’s  
26 Department of Job and Family Services (“DJFS”) seeks to renew its agreement with Summit and  
27 Medina Workforce Area Council of Governments (“SAMWA COG”) and Nesco to provide the  
28 aforementioned payroll services with administrative costs estimated at \$54,414.10 and  
29 \$1,341,224.00 in passthrough funds for youth payroll including wages, incentives, payroll taxes  
30 and workers’ compensation costs; and

32 WHEREAS, by having one payroll service provider, the burden of meeting payroll and  
33 carrying workers’ compensation coverage is alleviated for non-profits and employer sites for  
34 these temporary employees; and

35

36 WHEREAS, the State of Ohio recognizes this method as a cost effective manner to  
37 handle issuance of pay (youth wage subsidies) and workers’ compensation liability; and

38

39 WHEREAS, under this agreement, DJFS and SAMWA COG act as “grantors” of  
40 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (“WIOA”) and Temporary Assistance to Needy  
41 Families (“TANF”) funding for the provision of these services; and

42

43 WHEREAS, the overall cost of said payroll services for this renewal is based on the  
44 various employment programs enrolling up to 500 local youth; and

45

46 WHEREAS, the Board of Control, at its meeting held August 2, 2023, awarded a renewal  
47 (first of three) of a purchase contract with Nesco, for payroll services for the period 10/1/23  
48 through 9/30/24, for various youth employment programs, including summer youth and year-  
49 round programs, with three options to renew for additional one-year terms, in an amount not to  
50 exceed \$1,395,638.10, subject to confirmation by this Council; and

4 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information,  
5 that the aforementioned renewal of a purchase contract with Nesco is necessary and in the best  
6 interest of the County of Summit;

8 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State  
9 of Ohio, that:

11 SECTION 1

12

13 The award by the Board of Control of a renewal (first of three) of a purchase contract  
14 with Nesco Resource, LLC fka Callos Resource LLC, for payroll services for the period 10/1/23  
15 through 9/30/24, for various youth employment programs, including summer youth and year-  
16 round programs, with three options to renew for additional one-year terms, in an amount not to  
17 exceed \$1,395,638.10, is hereby confirmed and the Executive is hereby authorized to execute  
18 said renewal and any other necessary related documents.

20 SECTION 2

22 This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of health, safety and  
23 welfare of the residents of the County of Summit, and for the further reason that it is necessary to  
24 immediately provide required payroll services for various youth employment programs.

26 SECTION 3

28 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take  
29 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take  
30 effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

32 SECTION 4

34 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating  
35 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all  
36 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,  
37 were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including  
38 Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
