An <u>amended</u> Resolution authorizing the Executive to execute <u>Articles of Incorporation</u>, a <u>Code of Regulations</u>, an <u>agreement</u> and any other necessary related documents with the Akron Community Foundation in order to establish a Supporting Organization <u>that will be known as the "Summit Health and Safety Innovation Fund"</u>, in accordance with the terms of Exhibit A, to support the health and safety of County residents, and authorizing <u>the Executive to execute a Gift Agreement with the ACF and the Summit Health and Safety <u>Innovation Fund for</u> the contribution of an <u>initial</u> amount not to exceed \$45,000,000.00, and a total amount not to exceed \$70,000,000.00, of Opioid Settlement Dollars, to the Summit Health and Safety <u>Innovation Fund</u>, for the Executive, and declaring and emergency.</u>

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution Nos. 2019-332 and 2019-361, this Council authorized the Executive to settle any and all claims, and to execute any corresponding settlement agreements, in litigation titled In re: National Prescription Opiate Litigation, Case No. 1:17-MD-2804, before Judge Dan Aaron Polster in the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio (the "Lawsuit"), resulting in an unprecedented amount of settlements; and

WHEREAS, the Executive convened the Key Stakeholders Group and the Opiate Abatement Advisory Council ("OAAC") to help determine how to spend the opiate money to best serve the residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, an Opiate Abatement Strategy was developed as a guiding document for expending monies received through the settlement of the Lawsuit, and identified four pillars of focus: (1) treatment, (2) system and infrastructure, (3) harm reduction, and (4) education; and

WHEREAS, the County of Summit has a unique opportunity to dedicate settlement funds to support the health and safety of County residents through the creation of a separate, tax-exempt charitable organization to which will benefit all County residents for years to come and will help ensure that many of the additional challenges faced by our minority and disadvantaged residents in the areas of mental health, addiction, support recovery, and other pressing health and public safety concerns have an opportunity to be addressed; and

WHEREAS, the Executive wishes to support the establishment of a "Supporting Organization" of the Akron Community Foundation ("ACF"), as described in the Executive Summary and Term Sheet Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated fully herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the County would jointly develop with ACF a leadership structure for the Supporting Organization involving a Board of Directors and committees, <u>made up of subject matter experts who bring a diversity of thought and lived experiences</u>, through which thought leaders and experts will participate in framing the Supporting Organization's initiatives and oversee its operations. The Board of Directors of the Supporting Organization will define the strategic initiatives and guide the Supporting Organization's grant making, investments, and activities in an effort to address those health and safety issues most urgent to County residents and for which the Supporting Organization's funding and involvement are likely to make a positive and meaningful difference; and

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WHEREAS, the Supporting Organization is expected to have the flexibility to: (1) fund innovative approaches designed to drive positive health and safety outcomes, (2) provide seed funding for new and creative health, disease, and addiction prevention and/or treatment methodologies, (3) act as a convener to attract other funders and community partners for ongoing funding of successful projects initially funded by the Support Organization, and (4) invest in prevention protocols to abate the onset of health issues; and

WHEREAS, through the Gift Agreement with the ACF and Supporting Organization, the County would establish certain spending and fee restrictions for the funds contributed to the SO as outlined in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, this initiative will be a unique and longstanding dedication of funds that could transform healthcare programs and outcomes, ultimately advancing the social determinates of health, wellbeing, and public safety of County residents; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that in order to help ensure that future challenges in the areas of addiction, mental health and safety may be addressed through the continued creation of unique and innovative programming, it is necessary to dedicate settlement funds to the creation of a separate, tax-exempt charitable organization which will benefit all of our County residents and help ensure the additional challenges faced by our minority and disadvantaged residents may be addressed. In order to effectuate the creation of this Supporting Organization that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the Executive to execute Articles of Incorporation, a Code of Regulations an agreement and any other necessary related documents with the Akron Community Foundation in order to establish a Supporting Organization, in accordance with the terms of Exhibit A, and execute a Gift Agreement with the ACF and the established Supporting Organization to contribute an initial amount not to exceed \$45,000,000.00, and a total amount not to exceed \$70,000,000.00 of Opioid Settlement Dollars, in accordance with the terms of Exhibit A;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that;

SECTION 1

The Executive is hereby authorized to execute Articles of Incorporation, a Code of Regulations an agreement and any other necessary related documents with the Akron Community Foundation in order to establish a Supporting Organization that will be known as the "Summit Health and Safety Innovation Fund", in accordance with the terms of the Executive Summary and Term Sheet Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated fully herein by reference, to support the health and safety of County residents, and is authorized to execute the contribution of an initial amount not to exceed \$45,000,000.00, and a total amount not to exceed \$70,000,000.00, of Opioid Settlement Dollars.

SECTION 2

The Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Gift Agreement with the Akron Community Foundation and the Summit Health and Safety Innovation Fund for the contribution of an initial
