15 16 17	WHEREAS, mass shootings are defined by the Gun Violence Archive as an incident where at least four people were shot, either injured or killed, not including the shooter; and		
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the Gun Violence Archive reported 502 mass shootings in 2024 and as of April 22, 2025 there have been 102 mass shootings in 2025, and since 2013, there have been 6,634 mass shootings in the United States; and		
22 23 24	WHEREAS, suicides contributed to 6 in 10 gun deaths in 2023, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, with gun suicides reaching an all-time high in 2022; and		
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33	WHEREAS, gun violence in the United States has affected nearly every community, with mass shootings since the last Gun Violence Awareness Day including the June 2, 2024 shooting in Akron which killed one and injured 29 others, the July 6 shooting in Akron which injured a toddler and three adults, the January 1, 2025 truck attack and shooting on Bourbon Street in New Orleans, Louisiana which killed one and injured 5 with a firearm in addition to fourteen killed and dozens more injured in the truck attack, and the April 17 school shooting at Florida State University which killed two food service employees and injured 6 others including the shooter; and
