Summit County Special Operations Hazmat Team Handheld Gas Meter Project Specs

The Summit County Emergency Management Agency (SCEMA) is requesting bids for the purchase of (1) handheld and portable gas meter on behalf of the Summit County Special Operations Hazmat Team. The equipment that was in the cache has reached the end of life and is no longer able to be updated or used. They are in need of replacing detection equipment that has the same or enhanced capacities as the meter they were using. This new device would be used to respond to, recover from and mitigate attempts of terrorism by being able to identify unidentifiable chemicals and knowing where to stage recovery efforts. Additionally, this new piece of equipment should be able to identify a minimum of 5,000 gases at lower concentrations, as we know gases mixes and one can never tell what has spilled. Having a device that would be able to identify several classes of chemicals would immediately notify the responding personnel if they are in danger and what needs to occur next, more importantly it will allow them to know where to stage so proper recovery efforts are made.

BID RESPONSE

The following specifications and characteristics must be met with no deviations. These are the minimal acceptable properties. If no exceptions /clarifications are noted, the bid response will be deemed to be in full compliance.

You must upload a set of detailed contractor's specifications, data sheet of equipment and an itemized quote in the General Attachments. <u>Please ensure the quote includes the cost of shipping or delivery of equipment</u>. Please provide GSA pricing if you are a GSA approved vendor.

A bidder shall be considered responsive if the proposal responds to bid specifications in all material respects and contains no irregularities or deviations from the specifications which would affect the amount of the bid or otherwise give him a competitive advantage. The factors that the Board shall consider in determining whether a bidder on the contract is responsible include the experience of the bidder, financial condition, conduct and performance on previous contracts, facilities, management skills, and ability to execute the contract properly. Additionally, for construction contracts governed by Section 177.14, the additional criteria identified in that Section shall also be used to determine whether a bidder on a contract is responsible.
