7 **A Resolution authorizing the Executive to execute any documents necessary to accept the**
8 **award of the Opioid Remediation Grant from the Ohio Attorney General, in the amount of**
9 **\$134,240.00, with no local cash match, and awarding a professional service contract to**
10 **Oriana House, Inc., as a Best Practical Source, for Opioid Remediation services, for a one-**
11 **year term, in an amount not to exceed \$134,240.00, for the Executive and the Sheriff, and**
12 **declaring an emergency.**

13

14 WHEREAS, the Ohio Attorney General sought grant applications for the Opioid
15 Remediation Grant to improve outcomes for substance-addicted inmates in Ohio jails; and

16

17 WHEREAS, Oriana House, Inc., operates the Summit County Community Based
18 Correctional Facility (“CBCF”) and provides Medication Assisted Treatment (“MAT”) to
19 residents placed in the CBCF; and

20

21 WHEREAS, the Ohio Attorney General has awarded \$134,240.00 to the County, on behalf
22 of Oriana House, Inc., to support the expansion of MAT program, in the form of medications,
23 equipment and personnel, to enhance substance use treatment for residents placed in the CBCF;
24 and

26 WHEREAS, the Executive wishes to execute a professional service contract with Oriana
27 House, Inc., as a Best Practical Source, to continue and expand the MAT treatment program at the
28 CBCF, for a one-year term, in an amount not to exceed \$134,240.00; and

30 WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 177.01(h)(4)D. and 177.07(a)(5) of the Codified
31 Ordinances of the County of Summit, Oriana House, Inc. is a Best Practical Source because they
32 currently operate the CBCF and provide MAT services to residents at that facility; and

34 WHEREAS, the Board of Control, at its meeting held on January 14, 2026, awarded the
35 aforementioned contract to Oriana House, Inc., as a Best Practical Source, for Opioid Remediation
36 services, for a one-year term, in an amount not to exceed \$134,240.00, subject to the approval of
37 this Council; and

39 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information,
40 that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the Executive to
41 execute any documents necessary to accept the award of the aforementioned Opioid Remediation
42 Grant from the Ohio Attorney General and enter into a contract for Oriana House, Inc. to expand
43 MAT in the CBCF;

45 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State

6 The Executive is hereby authorized to execute any documents necessary to accept the
7 award of the Opioid Remediation Grant from the Ohio Attorney General, in the amount of
8 \$134,240.00, with no local cash match.

10 SECTION 2

12 The Executive is hereby authorized to enter into a professional service contract with Oriana
13 House, Inc. to continue and expand the use of Medication Assisted Treatment (“MAT”) for
14 residents in the Summit County Community Based Correctional Facility (“CBCF”) in accordance
15 with the grant from the Attorney General, for a term of one-year, in an amount not to exceed
16 \$134,240.00.

18 SECTION 3

20 This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and
21 welfare of the residents of the County of Summit and for the further reason to immediately
22 authorize the Executive to execute any documents necessary to accept the award of the Opioid
23 Remediation Grant from the Ohio Attorney General, so that the funds may be used to fund the
24 expansion of substance use treatment and MAT services at the CBCF as soon as possible.

26 SECTION 4

28 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect
29 immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and
30 be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

32 SECTION 5

34 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating
35 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all
36 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were
37 in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22
38 of the Ohio Revised Code.
