Two New Members Elected for County Council

Summit County Council will have two new members following the General Election in November.

Dr. David Licate (D) a Criminal Justice
Professor at the University of Akron and
former Stow City Councilman, will now
represent Stow, Munroe, Falls, Hudson
and parts of Cuyahoga Falls in District 3.
He succeeds long-time County Councilwoman Gloria Rodgers who was defeated
in the March primary by Republican Jeremy McIntyre. Rodgers' term expires at the
end of the year.

Joseph Kacyon (R) will represent constituents in Green, Coventry, Springfield, Lakemore, Mogadore and parts of South Akron in District 8. He was appointed by the Republican Party in August to replace Anthony DeVitis following DeVitis' resignation from Council.

Kacyon is one of three partners at Hoover & Kacyon, LLC, a law firm with three locations in Summit County. He defeated Democrat Matt Shaughnessy for the seat in the November election.

The rest of the eight Council District seats remained unchanged with Council incumbent candidates retaining their seats.

Council President **Rita Darrow (D)** defeated Yulia Gray to represent District 1 which

includes Richfield, Richfield Village, Boston and Boston Heights, Peninsula, Sagamore Hills, Northfield Center, Macedonia, Twinsburg and Twinsburg Township and Reminderville.

John Schmidt (D) (District 2—representing Cuyahoga Falls and Northeast Akron) and Jeff Wilhite (D) (District 4 – representing parts of West and Central Akron and Bath) were unopposed.

Brandon Ford (D) (District 5—representing West Akron, Copley, Fairlawn and Bath) defeated Cynthia Blake in the November election. Ford was appointed by the Democratic Party to replace former Councilwoman Veronica Sims who resigned in February to become the 33rd District Representative in the Ohio Statehouse.

Christine Wiede Higham (D) (District 6—representing Tallmadge and Southeast Akron) defeated Nick Rubino in the General Election and Bethany McKenney (R) (District 7—representing Barberton, New Franklin, Clinton, Norton and Southwest Akron) defeated Ryan Shank in the November contest.

The remaining three Council at Large seats currently held by Democrats **John Donofrio, Elizabeth Walters and Erin Dickinson** will be up for re-election in 2026.

Council Honors Ohio "Teacher of the Year"

Prior to the September 23rd Council Meeting, County Council and Executive Ilene Shapiro honored Twinsburg High School 11th and 12th grade English teacher Daneé Pinckney, Ohio's 2025 Teacher of the Year, an award established to by the Ohio Department of Education to honor the top teacher in the State. Ms. Pinckney created a senior-level course on African American Literature, addressing the need for representation by students and members of the community. She obtained grant funding to support its implementation, and her efforts have enriched educational experiences for all students and staff. Through literature, she aims to inspire her students to take part in community service and activism projects to foster social responsibility and civic engagement. Recently, her students collaborated with students in Ghana and led a schoolwide project that aimed to build global community and empathy. Ms. Pinckney's dedication to pursuing personal growth as an educator has earned her recognition as a Master Teacher Finalist by the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation and accolades such as the 2023 Twinsburg City Schools Teacher of the Year and a 2023 Fund for Teachers Fellow. A resident of Stow. Ms. Pinkney earned her Bachelor of Arts and Sciences in Middle Childhood Education from The Ohio State University and her Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction: Educational Technology from Ashland University. "Daneé represents the best of what every educator should aspire to be; dedicated and passionate with a perfect balance of high expectations for all students coupled with the will to provide whatever support those students need to be successful. We thank her for her outstanding work and continued commitment to her students and the community," said Council President Rita Darrow.

Council Members Participate in Rubber City Heritage Trail Dedication

County Council Members Brandon Ford (District 5) and Christine Wiedie Higham (District 6) joined in the dedication and ribbon cutting for the first section of the Rubber City Heritage Trail along with the City of Akron and Summit County officials, residents, and project partners. Phase I of the trail connects the current Goodyear World Headquarters to just behind the former headquarters off of East Market Street and is about a mile long. Once complete, the trail will be 6 miles long and connect the neighborhoods of Goodyear Heights. Middlebury, the University of Akron, Downtown Akron, Firestone Park, Summit Lake and Kenmore. The trail follows the former portion of the Akron & Barberton Cluster Railroad that once served B.F. Goodrich, Bridgestone, Firestone, General Tire, The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company and more.

Former Council President Nick Kostandaras Passes Away

Former County Councilman Nick Kostandaras, who represented District 1 from 2006 to 2016 passed away on August 27 at the age of 87. While on County Council, Kostandaras sponsored more than 600 pieces of legislation and attended more than 8,000 meetings with residents, businesses and local communities throughout Summit County, the state of Ohio and the United States.

Kostandaras was formerly a member of the Richfield City Council, former President and Legislative Director of Ohio Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union and a former Sheriff's Deputy in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Kostandaras was also proprietor of Nick's Automotive Auto Service and Musketeers Bar and Grill in Richfield, Ohio.

In 2007, Kostandaras served as interim County Executive for the County of Summit, and he served several terms as Vice President and President of Summit County Council. He also had the honor of serving as President of the County Commissioners Association of Ohio (CCAO) in 2014.

"We remember Nick for his commitment, diligence, integrity and dedication to public service, representing the residents of District 1 in the Cities of Macedonia and Twinsburg, Boston Heights, Northfield, Peninsula, Reminderville and Richfield Villages, Bath, Boston, Northfield Center, Richfield, Sagamore Hills and Twinsburg Townships and part of the City of Akron. He was passionate about his work with CCAO and he had the utmost admiration and respect from his colleagues on Council through his professionalism and devotion to his family, friends, colleagues and community. We appreciate his tireless efforts to make our communities better places to work and live and urge all citizens to join in honoring his memory," said Council President Rita Darrow (District 1).
