7 **A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute grant agreements with the City**
8 **of Hudson, in the amount of \$7,143.91, Northfield Village, in the amount of \$3,562.07 and**
9 **the Village of Reminderville, in the amount of \$26,245.02, from Fiscal Year 2011 State**
10 **Homeland Security Program grant funding, for the Executive's Department of Law,**
11 **Insurance and Risk Management - Division of Public Safety/Emergency Management**
12 **Agency, and declaring an emergency.**

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14 WHEREAS, the Summit County Emergency Management Agency ("SCEMA") receives
15 State Homeland Security Program ("SHSP") funds on an annual basis to provide capabilities to
16 better mitigate, prepare, respond and recover from an act of terrorism and other disasters; and

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18 WHEREAS, the City of Hudson requested \$121,682.97 and was previously awarded a
19 grant of \$60,000 to reimburse the city for the purchase of Summit County/Akron 800 MHz
20 Regional Radio System radios by Resolution No. 2013-520; and

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22 WHEREAS, Northfield Village requested \$62,250.00 and was previously awarded
23 \$27,562.93 to reimburse the village for the purchase of radios for the Summit County/Akron 800
24 MHz Regional Radio System by Resolution No. 2014-021; and

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26 WHEREAS, and the Village of Reminderville requested \$107,615.88 and previously was
27 awarded \$27,562.92 to reimburse the village for the purchase of radios for the Summit
28 County/Akron 800 MHz Regional Radio System by Resolution No. 2014-021; and

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30 WHEREAS, SCEMA has determined that excess funds still exist under this grant
31 program which must be disbursed prior to April 30, 2014, the expiration date of the grant period;
32 and

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34 WHEREAS, SCEMA has determined that the City of Hudson should receive additional
35 grant funding in the amount of \$7,143.91, Northfield Village should receive additional grant
36 funds of \$3,562.07 and Reminderville should receive additional grant funds of \$26,245.02 to
37 assist with the purchase of radios in order to join the Summit County/Akron 800 MHz Regional
38 Radio System; and

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40 WHEREAS, the Summit County Domestic Preparedness Steering Committee, the grant's
41 oversight committee, has previously recommended approval of these additional awards; and

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43 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information,
44 that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to authorize the County Executive to
45 award the aforementioned grants to the City of Hudson, Northfield Village and the Village of
46 Reminderville;

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48 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State

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4 SECTION 1

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6 The County Executive is hereby authorized to execute grant agreements with the City of
7 Hudson, in the amount of \$7,143.91, Northfield Village, in the amount of \$3,562.07, and the
8 Village of Reminderville, in the amount of \$26,245.02 from the Fiscal Year 2011 State
9 Homeland Security Program ("SHSP") grant funds.

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11 SECTION 2

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13 This Resolution is declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare
14 of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately awarding
15 grant funds in order to make radio purchases to provide interoperability on the county-wide radio
16 system and ensure expenditures are made within the grant period.

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18 SECTION 3

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20 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take
21 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take
22 effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

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26 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating
27 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all
28 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,
