The Summit County Juvenile Court has received Grant funding from the Department of Youth Services to provide necessary treatment, support and program evaluation to between 25-35 youth per year who have been identified by the court as either victims of human trafficking or at very high risk to become victims. The funds awarded have been allocated from RECLAIM Ohio Competitive RECLAIM Categories I and II. Under these special programs the Summit County Juvenile Court will contract with three provider agencies as described in the following outline.

- 1) OhioGuidestone will provide Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy or TF-CBT, Drug and alcohol counseling and Nurturing Parenting® family counseling as needed to youth in both Categories as indicated by assessment and program team input at a cost not to exceed \$62,220.00 per year for Medicaid non-eligible services at established and agreed upon hourly rates per type of service.
- 2) RAHAB Ministries, a nonprofit, faith-based organization that specializes in rescuing and restoring victims of human trafficking, will provide youth mentoring services to between 25-35 youth being served under both categories and receive compensation not to exceed \$48,500.00 per year.
- 3) The Begun Center for Violence Prevention Research and Education (Begun Center) and the Center for Innovative Practices (CIP) at Case Western Reserve University will provide quality assurance and program evaluation in collaboration with the Ohio Department of Youth Services, the Summit County Juvenile Court and program partner provider agencies at a cost not to exceed \$22,500.00 per year.
