- The petition circulators are misrepresenting that this amendment is needed to prevent partisan gerrymandering by County Council, when, in fact the current County Council districts have been essentially intact since 2001 and only 16 of 475 precincts, or 3.3%, were adjusted during the 2011 reapportionment; and
- Despite claims of the petition circulators that the amendment will stop/prevent gerrymandering in Summit County, the proposed amendment is actually a thinly veiled attempt by Republicans to gerrymander districts to be more beneficial to Republican candidates for County Council because they have been unsuccessful in being elected by a vote of the people of Summit County; and
- The petition circulators are misrepresenting that they are a non-partisan effort, when, in fact, social media, websites and other information clearly establish that this effort is actually a Republican attempt to gerrymander the County for their benefit; and
- Most disturbingly, the petition circulators are shamefully representing that their proposed districts will provide greater opportunity for minority representation when the exact opposite is true. Currently, County Council District 5 contains a population that is 50% minority, thereby providing a substantial opportunity for a historically underrepresented population to be represented on County Council. This proposal carves up the areas of the City of Akron where a significant portion of the African-Americans in Summit County reside into three County Council districts, thereby dropping all districts below the threshold of having at least 50% minority population. This Council is deeply concerned that such a step backwards may be a violation of the Federal Voting Rights Act which will open the County up to costly litigation. Additionally, such districts violate the proposed Charter amendment's language that calls for attention to be paid to providing historically underrepresented populations with an opportunity to be represented on County Council. Furthermore, this Council is extremely concerned that not only would the petition circulators advocate such a proposal, but they would deceive the public into thinking that they are actually increasing the opportunity for minority representation on Council; and
- The petition circulators have deceptively taken the language regarding apportionment of County Council districts wholesale from the Cuyahoga County Charter that creates an independent bipartisan commission to create Council districts, but have inserted two provisions that serve Republican gerrymanderinga new map for the 2016 election drawn by the petition circulators and their Republican cohorts, and a provision that dilutes Akron's importance in County Council districts; and
- Despite representing this as a bipartisan effort, the committee that appears on the petitions consists of four prominent Republican activists and/or officeholders and one Democrat. This committee, which appears to be responsible for the proposed 2016 gerrymandered districts, fails to meet the requirements of the bipartisan independent commission that the proposed amendment would task with redistricting the County in the future; and

• The petition circulators appear to have used no scientific or data-driven methodology in formulating their proposed districts for the 2016 election as this Council relied upon in 2001 and made only slight modifications to in 2011. Instead, the basis for the proposed 2016 districts appears to be increasing the chances for Republicans to win seats on County Council through gerrymandering rather than winning fair elections. One of the petition circulators, has stated publically that with minor "improvements" to address non-contiguous territories, the proposed 2016 districts are essentially what he proposed while on Council in 2011 when he devised his districting plan using no prior knowledge, expertise or training.

WHEREAS, the Charter amendment proposed by the petition circulators would overthrow districts that have been largely consistent for the last 15 years and would replace districts drawn by representatives elected by the public to do so with Districts drawn by partisans using no scientific data-driven process, knowledge or expertise; and

WHEREAS, the petition circulators are proposing to redraw districts in the middle of the period between federal Censuses, with no regard to changes in population or where the population currently resides in the County, and in doing so are deviating from the statewide redistricting effort which waits for the bipartisan commission to redistrict the state following the 2020 federal Census; and

WHEREAS, the amended 2016 Council Districts, as set forth in the petition, are purposefully designed to pit several Democratic Council Members against each other in two of the proposed redrawn districts, which will result in the loss to Council of a minimum of two experienced legislators;

WHEREAS, by creating districts for the 2016 general election, the proposed Charter amendment would take effect and change those districts only a few weeks prior to the deadline for candidates to file petitions for election to those Council districts, resulting in confusion and an unreasonably short time for individuals wanting to run for a Council seat to garner support and petition signatures. Additionally, given that the proposed 2016 districts would dramatically alter the potential for minority representation on the County Council, this short period of time is likely to be consumed by legal challenges to the validity of the proposed amendment; and

WHEREAS, given the misrepresentations and false statements of the petition circulators and the negative impact of the proposed Charter amendment, this Council must stand in opposition to the proposed Charter amendment and urge all citizens of Summit County to refuse to sign the same; and

WHEREAS, furthermore, concurrent with this Resolution, County Councilmembers have also introduced Resolution 2015-331, which would place a Charter amendment on the ballot for the 2015 general election that truly mirrors the Cuyahoga County Charter's provisions for an independent bipartisan commission to oversee redistricting in Summit County following the 2020 federal Census, without added language that gerrymanders current districts in favor of one political party over the other; and

WHEREAS, if the petition circulators are truly concerned about good government, fair districts, fair representation and transparency, they would support Resolution 2015-331 as the true non-partisan method to reapportion County Council districts rather than continuing forward with their proposed Charter amendment; and

WHEREAS, rather than force an ill-timed and immediate change to the County Council districts under the petition circulators' proposed amendment, the prudent path would be to wait until after the 2020 federal Census and allow a bipartisan independent commission to reapportion the County into Council districts; and

WHEREAS, finally, this Council finds and determines that it is necessary to denounce the misrepresentations, false statements, and self-serving attempt to gerrymander Summit County, and further calls on the petition circulators to support Resolution 2015-331 as true non-partisan reform for the citizens of Summit County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

This Council hereby opposes the Charter amendment being proposed by the aforementioned petition circulators that purports to (i) redraw the County Council districts for the 2016 general election, (ii) create an independent commission to perform redistricting in 2021, and (iii) limit the number of representatives for any particular community. A copy of the petition proposing the Charter amendment and being circulated by these individuals is attached hereto as Exhibit A. This Council calls upon all citizens of Summit County to refuse to sign the petition currently being circulated by the petition circulators. Furthermore, this Council denounces the misrepresentations, false statements and self-serving attempt to gerrymander Summit County, and further specifically condemns their deceitful attempts to obscure the negative impact that the proposed Charter amendment will have on minority representation on Summit County Council.

SECTION 2

This Council calls on the petition circulators to cease activities and to instead support Resolution No. 2015-331 and to avoid the hypocrisy of advocating for fair districts, fair representation, good government and transparency while actually proposing a Republican gerrymandering scheme.

SECTION 3

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and further immediately to state this Council's opposition during the time when the petition circulators are attempting to obtain petition signature for the proposed Charter amendment.
