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7 **A Resolution supporting Ohio's Race to the Top Round Two Application in the amount of**  
8 **\$400 million due June 1, 2010 to the U.S. Department of Education and encouraging school**  
9 **districts and public charter schools to support Ohio's Race to the Top Plan for the Council**  
10 **and the Executive, and declaring an emergency.**

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12 WHEREAS, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) lays the  
13 foundation for education reform by supporting investments in innovative strategies that could  
14 lead to improved results for students, long term gains in school and school system capacity, and  
15 increased productivity and effectiveness; and

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17 WHEREAS, the ARRA provides \$4.35 billion for the Race to the Top Fund to be  
18 awarded in two phases; and

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20 WHEREAS, the Race to the Top is a competitive grant program designed to encourage  
21 and reward States that have demonstrated success in raising student achievement and have the  
22 best plans to accelerate their reforms in the future; and

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24 WHEREAS, Race to the Top has in Round Two \$3.4 billion available to award to as  
25 many as 10 to 15 states in September, 2010; and

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27 WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Education is preparing its \$400 million second  
28 round application for a federal Race to the Top grant due June 1, 2010 to the U. S. Department of  
29 Education; and

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31 WHEREAS, the Race to the Top priorities generally align with Ohio's education  
32 policies; and

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34 WHEREAS, in the first round application process for the Race to the Top grant, Ohio  
35 was one of 16 finalist and tied for first place in the category of standards and assessments; and

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37 WHEREAS, Ohio has pledged if awarded a grant in Round Two, the majority of funds  
38 will be devoted to local school districts and public charter schools; and

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40 WHEREAS, thousands more Ohio students would achieve and graduate at higher levels  
41 if the state meets its four goals for Race to the Top and with full participation of local school  
42 districts and charter schools; and

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44 WHEREAS, the support of local communities is critical in gathering momentum for  
45 Ohio's application; and

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47 WHEREAS, Ohio has answered the call to initiate the bold and innovative reforms  
48 needed to make a significant impact on student performance, increase graduation rates, and  
49 eliminate the achievement gap; and

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51 WHEREAS, over the past decade, Ohio has moved education forward in spite of  
52 immense challenges; and

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4 WHEREAS, Ohio has been a pioneer in holding all schools accountable and providing  
5 them with data-driven decision making tools; and  
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7 WHEREAS, the state will provide the supports and best practices necessary to turn  
8 around persistently low-achieving schools and expand science, technology, engineering and  
9 mathematics (STEM) education opportunities; and  
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11 WHEREAS, the overall effectiveness of classroom instruction will be improved through  
12 investments in best practices, standards and curriculum, assessments and technology; and  
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14 WHEREAS, the Summit County Council and the Summit County Executive join the  
15 education leadership of the state in their quest to strengthen the educational system in Ohio so  
16 that all students may realize their full potential in classroom, graduate ready for college, and  
17 successfully complete in the global marketplace.  
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19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit,  
20 State of Ohio, that:

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24 The Summit County Council and the County Executive strongly support Ohio's Race to  
25 the Top Round Two Application and remain enthusiastic and vested partners in ensuring  
26 successful outcomes for students, teachers, and schools across the state. Further, all local  
27 communities are encouraged to support Ohio's Race to the Top Plan.

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31 This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and  
32 welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately

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37 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take  
38 effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take  
39 effect and be in force at the earliest possible time provided by law.

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43 It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating  
44 to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all  
45 deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,  
46 were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section  
47 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
