12 13 14 15 16 16	WHEREAS; in 2010, the U.S. Senate passed S. Res. 412, which designates the month of September 2010 as National Childhood Obesity Awareness Month in order to bring national attention to a growing epidemic among youth in the United States; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, during the past 4 decades, obesity rates have soared among all age groups, increasing more than four-fold among children ages 6 to 11; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, 31.8 percent or 23,000,000 children and teenagers ages 2 to 19 are obese or overweight, a statistic that health and medical experts consider an epidemic; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, significant disparities exist among the obesity rates of children based on race and poverty; and

## SECTION 1

In support of the month of September 2010 as National Childhood Obesity Awareness Month, the residents of Summit County are hereby encouraged to participate in any events and programs offered by the schools, libraries and political subdivisions within the County that promote awareness of childhood obesity.

## **SECTION 2**

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately supporting the month of September 2010 as National Childhood Obesity Awareness Month.

## **SECTION 3**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest possible time provided by law.
