A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute a settlement agreement to settle all claims arising out of or concerning issues raised in a lawsuit, *Gary Ellison v. County of Summit, et al.*, Case No. 5:10CV294, before Judge John Adams in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, for the Prosecutor, the Engineer and the Executive, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Gary Ellison, a former employee of the County Engineer, filed a wrongful termination lawsuit against the County of Summit, the Engineer's Office, the Engineer and Local 1032 American Federation of State County and Municipal Employees ("AFSCME") in the County Court of Common Pleas, *Gary Ellison v. County of Summit, et al.*, Case No. CV 2009-12-9308, before Judge Eleanor Marsh Stormer; and

WHEREAS, upon a petition by the defendants, the case was removed to the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio and retitled *Gary Ellison v. County of Summit, et al.*, Case No. 5:10CV294, before Judge John Adams; and

WHEREAS, in consultation with the County Prosecutor, the County Executive and County Engineer have reached terms of settlement with Mr. Ellison through his legal counsel to settle the case in the amount of \$35,000.00, plus the payment of any sum that Mr. Ellison previously received for unemployment compensation that must be repaid by Mr. Ellison as a result of the settlement; and

WHEREAS, the County further agreed to pay jury fees to the U.S. District Court, in an amount not to exceed \$1,760.00; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined by reviewing all pertinent information that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to settle the lawsuit filed by Mr. Ellison, in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.00, and to pay jury fees, in an amount not to exceed \$1,760.00, for the aforementioned reasons;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

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49 50 The County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a settlement agreement to settle all claims arising out of or concerning issues raised in a lawsuit, *Gary Ellison v. County of Summit, et al.*, Case No. 5:10CV294, before Judge John Adams in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, whereby the County will pay to Mr. Ellison the amount of \$35,000.00 plus any sum that Mr. Ellison previously received for unemployment compensation that must be repaid by Mr. Ellison as a result of the settlement, and further authorizing the payment of jury fees to the U.S. District Court, in an amount not to exceed \$1,760.00. The settlement agreement shall include a release by Gary Ellison of all claims against the County of Summit.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
