- (3) Corrupting another with drugs, unlawful sale, distribution or trafficking, or the intent to unlawfully sell, distribute or traffic any illegal drug, controlled substance or narcotic within seven (7) years of conviction or guilty plea;
  - (4) Any assault within seven (7) years of conviction or guilty plea; and
- (5) Unlawful possession of weapons within five (5) years of conviction or guilty plea; and
- (6) Any homicide offense identified in Section 2901.01 2903.01 et seq. of the Ohio Revised Code, or any substantially equivalent homicide offense under and Municipal law of another State.
- (e)(e) No individual shall be allowed to solicit under the provisions of this chapter who has not yet reached the age of eighteen (18).
  - (d)(f) No license shall be issued to individuals under the age of eighteen (18).

## SECTION 2.

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further purpose to amend the Codified Ordinances to expand the regulations for solicitors, peddlers and canvassers.

## SECTION 3.

The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance upon adoption to all law enforcement agencies in the County.

## SECTION 4.

Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of six members, it shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

## SECTION 5.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council, concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
