3 4 5	WHEREAS, in recent years, the people and businesses of Summit County, like most in the country, have suffered through difficult economic times; and
6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, as a result of the recent economic crisis, several property owners have lost their homes and businesses through foreclosure, and many sit vacant and abandoned to this day; and
0 1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, the high number of foreclosures and the associated number of vacant and abandoned properties in Summit County have contributed to the depression of the real estate market, with this year's real property appraisal performed by the Fiscal Office showing a decrease in value for all communities in Summit County; and
5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, in addition to affecting the property values of nearby homes and businesses, vacant and abandoned properties worsen other societal issues such as health, sanitation and crime, which in turn further depress the real estate market; and

WHEREAS, the professional services agreement between the County and the Western Reserve Land Conservancy will be funded entirely by grants from local non-profit entities; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to authorize the Executive, at the recommendation of the Fiscal Officer, to enter into an agreement with the Western Reserve Land Conservancy whereby it will assist the County in the investigation, creation and initial operation of a CRLC in Summit County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

## **SECTION 1**

Upon the recommendation of the Fiscal Officer, the Executive is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services agreement, subject to the approval of the Board of Control, with the Western Reserve Land Conservancy, as best practical source, for assistance in the investigation, creation and initial operation of a County Land Reutilization Corporation in Summit County, in the form set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

## **SECTION 2**

This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and for the further reason to immediately authorize the execution of the aforementioned agreement so that the Western Reserve Land Conservancy may immediately begin assisting the County in order to address the issues surrounding vacant and abandoned properties in the County.

## **SECTION 3**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

## **SECTION 4**

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
