WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to oppose the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency's initiative to combine the U.S. Census Bureau's Akron, Canton, and Cleveland Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

# SECTION 1

This Council opposes the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency's proposal to combine the Akron, Canton, and Cleveland U.S. Census Bureau's Metropolitan Statistical Area, which would effectively eliminate the Akron Metropolitan Statistical Area.

# **SECTION 2**

The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency's Executive Director and Executive Committee, Congressional Representatives in Summit and Portage Counties, the U.S. Office of Management and Budget, and the U.S. Census Bureau.

### SECTION 3

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit, and for the further reasons that it is immediately necessary to for the County of Summit to express its opposition to the elimination of the Akron MSA as such proposal could jeopardize federal funding received by the County of Summit.

### **SECTION 4**

 Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

#### **SECTION 5**

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
