A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to pay an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00, representing the County's self-insured retention, to Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company, the County's liability insurer, toward the costs of legal representation and services on behalf of the County and Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company in Raymond Angerstien, as Father and Administrator of the Estate of Ryan Angerstien, Deceased v. Springfield Township, et al., for the County Executive and the County Sheriff, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Raymond Angerstien has filed a lawsuit on behalf of the Estate of Ryan Angerstien against the County, Summit County Sheriff's Deputy Catherine Phillips and Summit County Sheriff's Deputy John Doe, <u>Raymond Angerstien</u>, <u>as Father and Administrator of the Estate of Ryan Angerstien</u>, <u>Deceased v. Springfield Township</u>, <u>et al.</u>, Case No. 5:20-cv-01333-JRA, before Judge John R. Adams in the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio (the "Lawsuit") arising out of the June 18, 2018 arrest of Ryan Angerstien; and

WHEREAS, the County's liability insurer, Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company, has agreed to defend the County and has retained counsel to provide legal representation and services on behalf of the County and Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company in the Lawsuit; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of its insurance contract with Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company, the County has a \$75,000.00 self-insured retention on a claims made basis; and

WHEREAS, in order to have counsel provide legal representation and services on behalf of the County and Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company in the lawsuit, the County is required to pay the first \$75,000.00 of costs, representing its self-insured retention; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit for the County Executive to pay an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00, to Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company toward the costs of legal representation and services by counsel on behalf of the County and Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company in the Lawsuit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The County Executive is hereby authorized to pay an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00, representing the County's self-insured retention, to Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company, the County's liability insurer, toward the costs of legal representation and services by counsel on behalf of the County and Tokio Marine Houston Casualty Company in <u>Raymond Angerstien</u>, as <u>Father and Administrator of the Estate of Ryan Angerstien</u>, <u>Deceased v. Springfield Township</u>, et <u>al.</u>, Case No. 5:20-cv-01333-JRA, before Judge John R. Adams in the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio (the "Lawsuit").
