A Resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute a grant application and any other documents necessary to apply to the U.S. Department of Labor for grant funds for the Akron/Summit TechHire Project, which will serve youth and young adults with barriers to training and employment, in the amount of \$4,000,000.00, with a 25% match requirement in leveraged funds and/or in-kind services, for the Executive's Department of Community and Economic Development, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Akron/Summit TechHire Project is seeking \$4,000,000.00 in funding from the U.S. Department of Labor to serve 440 youth and young adults between the ages of 17 and 29 with barriers to training and employment who meet the criteria for that group that was published in the TechHire Funding Opportunity Announcement by the Department; and

WHEREAS, the Akron/Summit TechHire Project will be 48 months in length and will consist of two major phases, with the first phase being a pilot project that will address the middle and higher skilled technological needs of northeast Ohio's employers in information technology and in information technology occupations across all sectors; and

WHEREAS, the pilot project will operate for all four years and will primarily serve the City of Akron, all of Summit County and the fringe communities in Cuyahoga, Medina, Stark, and Portage Counties that are contiguous with Summit County; and

WHEREAS, the Akron/Summit TechHire Project will be sustained and brought to scale in an expanded region of northeast Ohio in Years 3 and 4 through leveraged funding from government agencies, employer contributions, foundation grants, and other sources to sustain the services within Summit County, its contiguous counties and the other counties of Northeast Ohio, including Lorain, Lake, Wayne, Holmes, Tuscarawas, Mahoning Columbiana, Carroll, Geauga, and Ashland; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the County of Summit to be the applicant for said funds; and

WHEREAS, the 25% match requirement as set forth in the application will be in the form of leveraged funds and/or in-kind services; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to authorize the County Executive to execute a grant application and any other documents necessary to apply to the U.S. Department of Labor for grant funds for the Akron/Summit TechHire Project, which will serve youth and young adults with barriers to training and employment, in the amount of \$4,000,000.00, with a 25% match requirement in leveraged funds and/or in-kind services;
