NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The month of February 2022 is hereby declared Black History Month in Summit County and the residents of Summit County are encouraged to join in this acknowledgement and recognize the role that racial diversity and inclusion plays in strengthening our community.

SECTION 2

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and employees of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately declaring February 2022 as Black History Month in Summit County.

SECTION 3

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 4

INTRODUCED

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
