WHEREAS, people across the United States experience mental health conditions that impact their individual health and wellbeing as well as their relationship with the community; and		
WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic affected interpersonal relationships by limiting access to offices, schools, stores, stadiums, theaters, and museums, and limited access to mental health services through a lack of in-person services and increasing or intensifying mental illness and distress, thereby deteriorating the wellbeing of people across the country, including in Summit County; and		
WHEREAS, the silver lining of the pandemic is a heightened awareness and understanding of mental health, mental illness or distress, and mental wellbeing and its connection to physical and overall health; and		
WHEREAS, Mental Health Awareness Month, observed since 1949, has served as a vehicle for awareness, education, and advocacy around mental health and provides an opportunity for residents to highlight the difficulties of the past few years; and		
WHEREAS, Summit County is committed to improving the mental health of residents by leading and collaborating on initiatives and programs that provide education, events, and services involving mental health; and		
WHEREAS, Change Direction is a campaign by the Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services (ADM) Board that aims to change the culture around mental health in Summit County and improve the emotional well-being of residents, and provides an opportunity for community members and organizations to get involved in fostering mental wellness; and		
WHEREAS, other programs like Mental Health First Aid training offered by organizations such as Love Akron provide other opportunities for residents to learn and raise awareness about mental health; and		
WHEREAS, Summit County is currently participating in Upward Mobility, an Urban Institute project focused on combating poverty, and one of this project's priorities is to increase the mental wellness of Summit County by leveraging stakeholders like the ADM Board and NAMI to improve the livelihoods of residents; and		
WHEREAS, Summit County residents experiencing a mental health crisis should always see emergency help at 911 or 1-800-273-8255; and		
WHEREAS, supporting and educating the community on mental health and wellness is crucial to preventing crises and fostering a healthy, thriving County; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit that May 2022 be declared Mental Health Awareness Month in Summit County and encouraging the residents of Summit County to join in this acknowledgement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The month of May 2022 is hereby declared Mental Health Awareness Month in Summit County and the residents of Summit County are encouraged to join in this acknowledgement.

SECTION 2

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents and employees of the County of Summit and for the further purpose of immediately declaring May 2022 as Mental Health Awareness Month in Summit County to encourage prompt and widespread dialogue about mental health during the month of May.

SECTION 3

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 4

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
