A Resolution confirming the award by the Board of Control of a construction contract with Kenmore Construction Co., Inc. for the Cleveland-Massillon Phase 1 & 2 Project, at a total cost not to exceed \$3,371,939.56, with a local cash match not to exceed \$1,971,939.56, located in Copley Township, in Council District 5, for the Engineer, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Cleveland-Massillon Phase 1 & 2 Project (the "Project") will be divided into two phases with Phase 1 including pavement repairs, shoulder restoration and resurfacing, and pavement markings on 1.77 miles of Cleveland Massillon Road from the Norton line to 0.1 miles north of Minor Road and located north of Brenner Road and south of Stimson Road there is a 600-foot-long section of Cleveland-Massillon Road that is between two high walls of rock cut that start immediately behind the existing curbs. Pedestrians in this area are forced to walk in the street through this corridor. This project will provide a 6-foot-wide area behind the curb for use by pedestrians. Construction estimate for this section was \$1,100,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Phase 2 will include pavement repairs, shoulder restoration and resurfacing, and pavement markings on 1.8 miles Cleveland Massillon Road from .4 miles north of Minor to just south of E. Ridgewood Road. Construction estimate for this section is \$1,170,000.00; and

WHEREAS, federal funds will cover \$1,400,000.00 towards the total construction cost of \$3,371,939.56, and the Executive and Engineer have requested AMATS provide an additional 15% towards the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Council subsequently adopted Resolution 2021-388, which authorized the Executive to advertise for bids for the Project, as part of bridge engineering and construction projects, and pavement maintenance projects, for the Engineer's 2022 Capital Improvements Program, and federal and state funded projects, for an estimated total cost not to exceed \$12,724,400.00; and

WHEREAS, said projects were approved as part of the Capital Improvements Program for 2022-2027 by Resolution No. 2022-032; and

WHEREAS, in order to maximize efficiency and reduce time and cost, both Phases were bid at the same time; and

WHEREAS, following the receipt and review of bids, which were over the Engineer's estimates due to rising costs and inflation, the Executive has proposed entering into a construction contract with Kenmore Construction Co., Inc., at a total cost not to exceed \$3,371,939.56, with a local cash match not to exceed \$1,971,939.56, as it is unlikely that the costs will stop increasing during the timeframe of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Control, at its meeting held on June 8, 2022, awarded a construction contract with Kenmore Construction Co., Inc., as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, for the Project, at a total cost not to exceed \$3,371,939.56, with a local cash match not to exceed \$1,971,939.56, subject to confirmation by this Council; and
