RESOLUTION NO. 2023-116 First Reading Passage Requested 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 (Executive Shapiro) SPONSOR Executive Shapiro and Council as a Whole COMMITTEE Committee as a Whole DATE April 24, 2023 A Resolution urging the General Assembly to amend Substitute Ohio House Bill 33 to restore the governor's proposed 90% funding level by restoring the \$48 million removed from the Governor's Budget recommendation and supporting a full 100% state reimbursement for indigent defense and efforts to create a uniform and adequately funded statewide indigent defense system, for the Executive and Council, and declaring an emergency. WHEREAS, in Ohio, the responsibility to provide the constitutional right to a lawyer in a criminal case, falls upon the State. WHEREAS, The current system places the burden on counties to operate the indigent defense system, funding both public defenders and court appointed counsel and then hoping the State will adequately reimburse these costs; and WHEREAS The State of Ohio provides a level of reimbursement to counties through an appropriation in the state budget; and WHEREAS, historically the reimbursement rate has left the Counties shouldering the majority of the cost, averaging just 37% from 1998 through June 30, 2019, resulting in a strain on Summit County's General Fund and below market fees paid to attorneys who participate in the program; and WHEREAS, funding increases enacted by the DeWine-Husted Administration and the General Assembly enacted in 2019 resulted in counties receiving reimbursement rates greater than experienced in previous decades; and WHEREAS, unfortunately, these increases, while much appreciated, have not remedied the continued funding challenges for indigent representation, as counties across the state begin to pay attorneys the hourly rates requested by the Ohio Public Defender, the 90% reimbursement from the State for FY2023 will no longer be provided to counties due to lack of sufficient appropriation; and WHEREAS, Governor DeWine's 2024-25 budget includes funding to keep counties at the 90% reimbursement level but the newly introduced Substitute House Bill 33 decreases funding for reimbursement from the Governor's Budget by \$48 million over the biennium; and WHEREAS, The Office of the Public Defender estimates that the level of funding in the House Substitute Bill would provide about 78% reimbursement, leaving counties with a significant financial burden for the State's constitutionally mandated service; and WHEREAS, a statewide rise in traffic violations, misdemeanors and felonies, and attorney costs leaves counties with no choice but to either expend more money from their general funds or reduce attorney reimbursement rates; and

WHEREAS, we urge the members of the General Assembly to amend Substitute Ohio House Bill 33 to restore the governor's proposed funding level and to additionally support a full 100% reimbursement for indigent defense; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to support a 100% indigent defense reimbursement rate and oppose any decrease to the Governor's proposed rate of reimbursement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1

The Executive and this Council support the portion of the Governor's budget that includes a 90% indigent defense reimbursement rate and request that the State Legislature amend Substitute Ohio House Bill 33 to restore the \$48 million removed from the Governor's Budget recommendation over the biennium.

SECTION 2

The Executive and this Council additionally support a full 100% state reimbursement for indigent defense and efforts to create a uniform and adequately funded statewide indigent defense system for the residents of Summit County and the State of Oho.

SECTION 3

The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Ohio Governor and Lieutenant Governor, the Ohio Speaker of the House, the Ohio Senate President, and the Summit County delegation of the Ohio General Assembly.

SECTION 4

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit and for the further reason to immediately authorize any of the aforementioned settlements to occur in a timely fashion and in accordance with applicable laws and rules governing such settlements.

SECTION 5

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

SECTION 6

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
