WHEREAS, less than one year ago, the Ohio General Assembly eliminated most August special elections in H.B. 458 of the 134th General Assembly, a change supported by Ohio Secretary of State Frank LaRose, the Ohio Association of Election Officials, the County Commissioners Association of Ohio and many other stakeholders. Now, just months later, the general assembly has proposed reversing some of these changes to allow for a special election in August 2023. WHEREAS, S.B. 92 would amend 3501.022 to enact section (B), expanding the 19 circumstances under which a special election may be held in August to include a statewide ballot 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 issue passed by the Statehouse; and WHEREAS, S.B. 92 appropriates \$20 million to the Secretary of State in FY 2023 to pay the cost of conducting a special election on August 8, 2023; and WHEREAS, the cost of holding an August election in Summit County is nearly \$700,000. In August 2022, use of these funds for an August election resulted in a low, 6.8% voter turnout, costing an estimated \$28.29 per voter in Summit County; and WHEREAS, it is a challenge to local Boards of Elections to staff all primary and general elections with volunteer Precinct Election Officials and it is even more challenging to staff an 31 August special election. It is also a burden on Board of Election staff who pre-plan well-deserved 32 and earned time off and other important events during the summer; and 33 34 WHERAS, Counties Boards of Elections have prepared for the 2023 election cycle without 35 planning for a special August election. Boards will have to secure polling locations, ensure staff 36 are available, and recruit enough volunteers to successfully run the elections, all while preparing 37 for the November 2023 general election; and 38 39 WHERAS, the Summit County Board of Elections and its staff can more productively use 40 this time by preparing new voting equipment and working on the facility and equipment 41 implementation improvements necessary to conduct the 2024 presidential elections; and 42 43 WHEREAS, it is clear that holding special elections in August would result in unnecessary 44 costs to the taxpayers and a low voter turnout historically seen in these elections, and create 45 significant administrative issues; and 46 47 WHEREAS, these elections were described by the Ohio Secretary of State as "unnecessary 48 and not good for taxpayers, election officials, voters or the civic health of our state" and declared, 49 "it's time for them to go!" 50 51 52

WHEREAS, the Ohio Senate passed S.B. 92 on April 19, 2023 and it was introduced in the Ohio House on April 20, 2023.

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County to oppose the passage of Ohio Senate Bill 92.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

# SECTION 1

This Council opposes proposed changes to Ohio Revised Code Section 3501.022 as contained in Ohio Senate Bill 92 that would reverse changes made in H.B. 458 and declare a special election on August 8, 2023.

## **SECTION 2**

The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Ohio Governor and Lieutenant Governor, the Ohio Secretary of State, the Ohio Speaker of the House, the Ohio Senate President, and the Summit County delegation of the Ohio General Assembly.

## **SECTION 3**

This Resolution is hereby declared an emergency in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Summit and for the further reason to immediately authorize any of the aforementioned settlements to occur in a timely fashion and in accordance with applicable laws and rules governing such settlements.

### **SECTION 4**

Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight members, it shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Executive; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time provided by law.

## **SECTION 5**

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
