Wilhite and Walters to lead Council in 2019

At the January 7th Organizational Meeting, Summit County Councilmembers elected Councilman **Jeff Wilhite** as President and Councilwoman **Elizabeth Walters** as Vice President for 2019.

Wilhite and Walters both joined Council together in 2016. Wilhite replaced former District 4 member Frank Comunale and Walters replaced former At Large member Sandra Kurt.

Wilhite's district term runs through 2020 and Walters was recently re-elected for her second term at Large.

The new Council President currently serves as executive director of Family Promise of Summit County, a program serving homeless children and their families.

Walters is a senior associate at the Morino Institute. She will also Chair the Council's Planning and Economic Development Committee.

Councilman Hamilton Adopts Local Families for "Not Just October" Christmas Event





During the recent Holiday Season, District 5 Summit County Councilman David Hamilton adopted 10 families as part of a collaborative effort with Lavar Jacobs' "Not Just October" organization. "Not Just October" aids families dealing with hardship due to Breast Cancer. Both Jacobs and Councilman Hamilton lost their mothers to Breast Cancer.

All 10 Families were given the Christmas they deserved, with Jacobs and Hamilton personally delivering gifts to their homes with assistance from their volunteer "elves".

"These families that we were blessed to serve are really dealing with a lot, and every child should have a nice Christmas regardless of their circumstances," said Hamilton. "These women are amazing and we were very excited about the opportunity to help them. Christmas can be a hard time of the year and we didn't want anyone to feel like they were lacking. We hope 2019 is even better for these families," concluded Jacobs.

Council Recognizes University of Akron Men's Soccer Team for National Finalist Season

On January 28th, Summit County Council honored the University of Akron Men's Soccer Team for their 2018 National Finalist Season. The Zips overcame a slow 6-6-2 start with a 9-0 run to their sixth College Cup appearance. Despite losing several key players from the 2017 College Cup team and adding 18 new players, the Zips captured their seventh consecutive Mid-American Conference Championship league tournament title, their 15th MAC Tournament title, 33rd NCAA Tournament berth and 13th straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

Led by Coach Jared Embick, the Zips defeated unseeded Rider at home 3-1; avenged an earlier season loss to 16th-seeded Syracuse on the road 3-1; knocked off top-seeded Wake Forest, the winningest program in the last four seasons, in an impressive 1-0 win on the road; then secured back to back trips to the NCAA College Cup with a 3-2 victory over three-time national champion Stanford, which had knocked the Zips out of the College Cup last season and in 2015.

The Zips capped their 2018 Season with a 5-1 win over Michigan State in the semifinals before falling 1-0 on a penalty kick to Maryland in the National Title Game. The Zips finished the campaign with a 15-7-2 record overall.

Prior to Veteran's Day, **Councilwoman At Large Elizabeth Walters** (right) presented a Commendation to 82nd Airborne Division Association Officers, Secretary LaDonna Blue Eye (center) and local Association Chair Charles Higgins (left).

The 82nd Airborne Division Association is for anyone who ever served or is currently serving in the 82nd Airborne Division, and anyone who is currently serving on active duty on jump status; or, has ever served in any of the uniformed services on either jump or glider status and was honorably discharged. The Association was organized in England, prior to the Normandy invasion in 1944. Akron is the oldest continuous Association Chapter in the United States.

On Christmas Eve, **Councilwoman Bethany McKenney (District 7)** presented a Commendation honoring the 70th Anniversary of Vincent Gerek, a patrolman who died in the line of duty investigating a holdup at the Kroger Grocery Store on Fourth Street at Creedmore Avenue in Barberton, on December 24, 1948. Officer Gerek courageously sacrificed his own life in his attempt to protect the store merchants and two patrons from harm inside the establishment. To date, Officer Gerek is the only Barberton Police Officer to die in the line of duty. His badge, #8, has been permanently retired within the department and his name has been inscribed on the National Law Enforcement Officer's Memorial in Washington, D.C., which was erected in 1990. Accepting the Commendation in his honor is his nephew Tim Gerek (left).
