Council Welcomes Two New Members



Two new County Council Members were recently appointed to replace At-Large Member, Sandra Kurt and District 4 Representative Frank Comunale.

Kurt resigned after being named the new Summit County Clerk of Courts, succeeding new Akron Mayor, Dan Horrigan, and Comunale ended his term on Council after accepting a new position with the Summit County Department of Job and Family Services.

The new Council Members are Elizabeth Walters (At-Large) and Jeff Wilhite (District 4).



Walters comes to Council with previous experience as executive director of the Ohio Democratic Party, and as Ohio's former 13th Congressional District senior aide to Congresswoman Betty Sutton. Liz is a graduate of Cuyahoga Falls High School, earned her bachelors degree from Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, PA and her masters degree in public administration from Cleveland State University.

Wilhite currently serves as executive director of Family Promise of Summit County, a program serving homeless children and their families.

University of Akron Football Team Honored By Council



Prior to the February 29th Council Meeting, Coach Terry Bowden and University of Akron Football Team was honored with a Commendation from Summit County Council, presented by Councilman **John Schmidt (District 2)** for their outstanding 2015 Season, which culminated with a 23-21 win in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl over Utah State. The Zips finished the season with an 8-5 record, winning their last five games in a row and defeating teams from seven different states. Their eight victories were the most in school history since UA began play in the NCAA Football Bowl Sub Division (Division I) in 1987. The Bowl appearance was also the first in school history and the program's first bowl victory.

Headed by Summit County Councilwoman **Paula Prentice** (District 8), Let's Move Summit County has hosted Community Health Walks and events since 2010. This year, the walk is being dedicated to the issue of infant mortality. Councilwoman Prentice (and Councilwoman **Gloria Rodgers (District 3)** (both members of the Summit County Council Health and Human Services committee) have been actively involved with efforts related to the infant mortality crisis in Ohio, particularly in Summit County. Recent Public Health reports rank Ohio as having one of the worst infant mortality rates in the nation and Summit County having one of the highest infant mortality rates in the state.

The 2016 Health Walk is a FREE event intended to inform, engage and provide a healthy event for children and families.
